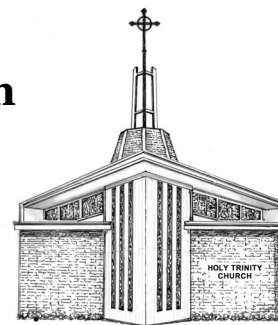

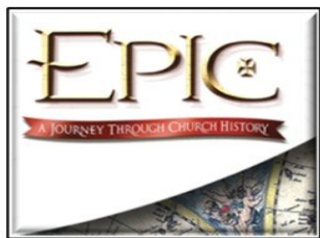

EPIC: A JOURNEY THROUGH CHURCH HISTORY



In the last three Epic episodes, the very knowledgeable Steve Weidenkopf begins with a summary of what the Protestant Revolt actually was; highlights key figures like Queen Mary (misnamed ‘Bloody’

Mary) and Queen Elizabeth (misnamed ‘Good’ Queen Bess); and describes the aftermath of it all. He then explores the Church’s response, known as the Catholic Reformation. In the final class, Weidenkopf discusses the secular roots of reason at the exclusion of God.

Connie Pratt will address crucial issues such as advanced directives, medical powers of attorney, and the dangerous pressures we may face when most vulnerable.



Deacon Pete McCann will then advise us about selecting funeral homes and cemetery or columbarium sites. He will suggest ways to tell loved ones when to call a priest and what Catholic Funeral Liturgy we want. He will also explain Anointing of the Sick, the Last Rites, and the Apostolic Blessing.

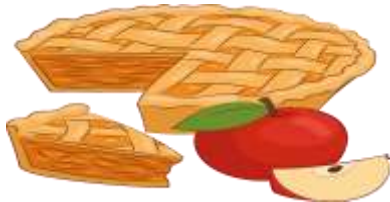
