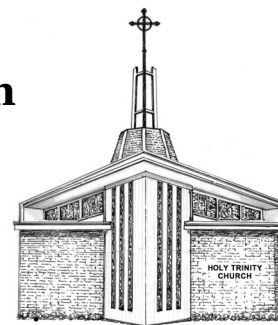

If there is a snow **delay** for Corpus Christi Catholic School or District 11, we **will** have Mass on Tuesdays at noon;

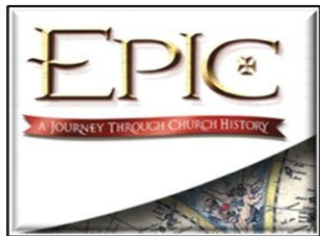
**No** Masses if a delay lands on Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday.

## Adult Catholic Studies

### EPIC: A JOURNEY THROUGH CHURCH HISTORY



In the last three Epic episodes, the very knowledgeable Steve Weidenkopf begins with a summary of what the Protestant Revolt actually was; highlights key figures like Queen Mary (misnamed 'Bloody')

Mary) and Queen Elizabeth (misnamed 'Good' Queen Bess); and describes the aftermath of it all. He then explores the Church's response, known as the Catholic Reformation. In the final class, Weidenkopf discusses the secular roots of reason at the exclusion of God.

Connie Pratt will address crucial issues such as advanced directives, medical powers of attorney, and the dangerous pressures we may face when most vulnerable.

## Did You Know?

In a series of revelations to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s, our Lord called for a special feast day to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter.

Today, we know that feast as Divine Mercy Sunday, named by Pope St. John Paul II at the canonization of St. Faustina on April 30, 2000.

The Lord expressed His will with regard to this feast in His very first revelation to St. Faustina. The most comprehensive revelation can be found in her Diary entry 699:

My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy.

Divine Mercy Sunday is NOT a feast based solely on St. Faustina's revelations. Indeed, it is not primarily about St. Faustina — nor is it altogether a new feast. The Second Sunday of Easter was already a solemnity as the Octave Day of Easter. The title "Divine Mercy Sunday" does, however, highlight the meaning of the day.

## Fourth Annual Discernment Retreat

The Diocese of Colorado Springs will host the fourth annual Discernment Retreat for single men between the ages of 18 - 40. The retreat is scheduled for July 18, 2026, at the St. John Henry Newman Center located at 4785 Stanton Road, Colorado Springs.

Registration begins at 12:15 PM. The retreat will start at 12:30 PM.

Mr. Lehnertz reflected on last year's retreat: "Our retreats are paying huge Spiritual dividends in the form of seminarians. We're pleased that we receive very positive feedback from the discerners and several of them are now seminarians. Please keep all of the discerners and our seminarians in your prayers."

Lehnertz added, "we are changing the format slightly this year. We'll continue with the Seminarian's Panel because it's a real hit with the discerners. The primary change will be a Parent's Seminar consisting of parents of priests or seminarians meeting with parents of the discerners. Parents of the discerners are invited to attend the break out session and share their questions, concerns or any other issues with parents of priests or seminarians."

Another change is the focus of the retreat itself. In previous years we have received questions about priests who belong to a religious order such as the Franciscans. Our retreats are focused on Diocesan Priests; these are priests who, upon ordination, will serve at one of the parishes in the Diocese of Colorado Springs. As in previous years, the retreat will culminate with Adoration and the Rosary.


