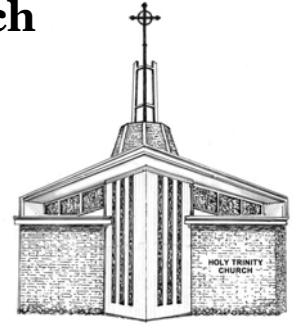

Adult Catholic Studies



On **April 27th**, Deacon Rick Athey, a psychiatrist, will present Exorcism and the Demonic. He will tell us about Satan and the fallen angels and situate them in the Bible; describe their powers of Temptation, Obsession, Oppression, Infestation, Vexation, and Possession; and discuss how they enter our lives. He will then summarize the Catechism's teaching on exorcism and cite many of Jesus' own exorcisms. Finally, Deacon Rick will tell us how to recognize and repel the powers of Satan and what to do if we suspect demonic influence.

On **May 4th**, Deacon Pete McCann will tell us what we need to know about planning for a funeral. He will share thoughts and recommendations on selecting a funeral home and a burial site or columbarium. He will prepare us to tell loved ones when to call a priest and to explain how to choose the Catholic Funeral Liturgy desired by the deceased. He will explain the important Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick and the Last Rites (Viaticum). He will also recommend we seek professional legal and tax advice well in advance, while we are able to do so. Following Deacon Pete's remarks, Connie Pratt will summarize some of the critical end-of-life issues such as medical powers of attorney, advanced health-care directives, and dangerous pressures and suggestions we may face when we are most susceptible to them.

Diocesan Ministry Appeal

Circumstances can change in an instant. Our "secure" position at work can be eliminated. One blood test at a routine physical can reveal an unexpected illness. A unexpected storm can take the roof off our home. Jesus knew this. He entered Jerusalem to great fanfare on Palm Sunday. Huge crowds gathered to welcome Him, waving palm fronds, calling, "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, [even] the king of Israel" (John 12:13). Just days later, Jesus would celebrate the Last Supper with His apostles before spending an agonizing night of prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane where He was betrayed and abandoned. Five days later, He'd die a torturous death alongside criminals.

When a reversal in fortune rattles us, we can remind ourselves that Jesus understands our anxiety. He is there for us; we can rely on Him and draw strength from His peace. And if we are experiencing a period of calm and plenty, we can help those whose circumstances are not so blessed through a gift to the Diocesan Ministry Appeal.

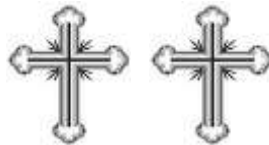
