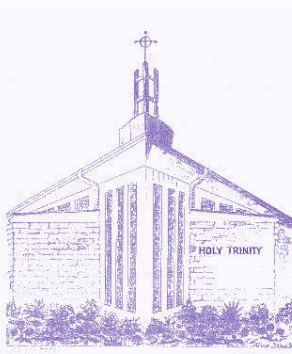

Sacraments

Baptisms: Baptism preparation class is required for all parents and godparents, and they must be registered in a Catholic parish and members in good standing.

Contact the parish office to schedule an appointment.

Marriage: All engaged couples participate in a Marriage Preparation Program (a policy of the Diocese of Colorado Springs), Contact the parish office AT LEAST ONE YEAR IN ADVANCE of your planned marriage to begin preparation.

Sacrament of the Sick/Emergencies: Dial 633-2132, x1002. Calls are monitored on a regular basis.

Funerals: Please call the parish office **before** scheduling date and time with a funeral home. The parish office schedules presiders, musicians, and servers in consultation with family members.

Adult Catholic Studies

On **April 23rd**, we'll focus on the Church's role in "Preserving the Truth" through apostolic succession, the primacy of Peter, and the Church in Rome.



We'll begin with Egeria, a late-4th century woman called The Pilgrim because of the journal she kept of visits to OT and NT sites.

We'll learn that, like Peter and Paul, and Saints Clement, Ignatius of Antioch, and Irenaeus emphasized the papacy and apostolic succession.

We'll meet Pope St. Leo the Great, who not only confronted the Arian, Nestorian, and Monophysite heretics of his time, but also bravely faced down Attila the Hun and, later, the invading Goths.

And we'll end with a discussion of Pope St. Gregory the Great, who emphasized the unity which comes through the Eucharist; ended liturgical abuse; and promoted what we now call Gregorian Chant.

On **April 30th**, we'll learn how St. Ephrem outsmarted heretics who'd been confusing the Christians of Edessa. We'll discover how graffiti and sacred images in the catacombs – and ancient mosaics in Ravenna – taught the connection between OT types and NT fulfillments, in a time when there were few books and extensive illiteracy.

We'll learn about the 'disciple of the secret,' so important before Constantine legalized Christianity.

We'll also see that, before Easter, those coming into the Church learned about the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and Salvation History...and between Easter and Pentecost, they learned that all was ordered to the Sacraments, where we get a taste of heaven and the grace we need for Earth.

Join us to learn about the powerful witness both the Bible and the earliest believers give to our Church. Find out how to better share these truths with non-Catholics who, through no fault of their own, don't yet understand.

Sacramentals

Sacramentals “are sacred signs which bear a resemblance to the sacraments. They signify effects, particularly of a spiritual nature, which are obtained through the intercession of the Church. By them, men are disposed to receive the chief effect of the sacraments, and various occasions in life are rendered holy” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, No. 1667).

“Among sacramentals, blessings (of persons, meals, objects, and places) come first. Every blessing praises God and prays for his gifts. In Christ, Christians are blessed by God the Father ‘with every spiritual blessing’” (Catechism, No. 1671).

Blessings of priests and bishops have the power, so to speak, to turn objects such as a new rosary or statue into a sacramental. While the laity can bless, their blessings are more of a prayer or a plea to God.

The blessing at meals is a chance to offer God a prayer of praise and thanksgiving. It makes holy the mere need for nutrition and is a reminder of the most blessed meal, the Eucharist.

A parent's blessing of their children serves as a petition to God to keep their kids safe from all evil.

An exorcism is a sacramental. It takes place when the Church asks publicly and authoritatively in the name of Jesus Christ that a person or object be protected against the power of the Evil One and withdrawn from his power.

Exorcisms may be minor, also called simple exorcisms, or major, called solemn exorcisms. Minor exorcisms occur in the Rite of Baptism and during the RCIA process, where candidates are asked to rebuke Satan and all his evil ways. If you have been baptized you have been part of an exorcism. A major exorcism, which attracts much attention and curiosity, is directed at the expulsion of demons or freedom from demonic possession through the spiritual authority which Jesus entrusted to his Church (see Catechism, No. 1673). Often used in a major exorcism are the sacramentals of holy water, blessed salt and a crucifix.”
