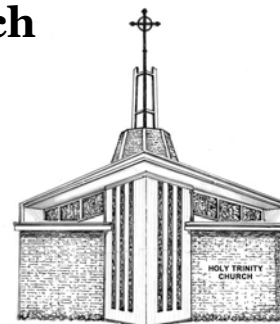

## REFRESH YOUR FAITH!!!



On **April 28th**, we will explore the reality and nature of Satan and learn about the power he can exert over us.

In this special class, Deacon Rick Athey, an experienced psychiatrist and a member of the diocesan exorcism team, will discuss the various means Satan can use to influence us, and the ways we can protect ourselves.

## Adult Catholic Studies



On **April 28th**, we will present Dr. Brant Pitre's fascinating talk based on his book, *Jesus and The Jewish Roots of the Eucharist*. Helping us see how the Apostles, all Jews, could so easily accept Christ's teaching on the Eucharist, Pitre cites the foreshadowings which helped: Passover, Manna from Heaven, and Bread of the Presence.

On **May 5th**, we will respond to the reasons non-Catholics and many Catholics doubt the Real Presence and consider the Mass just a boring ritual or a meaningless obligation. We will see that Mass has a "cosmic character," permeating all Creation. We will learn it is a "wrinkle in time" which offers the most intimate of all earthly encounters with God. We will discover that the Eucharist is not a generic thing, since Jesus desires each of us individually and comes to us, one-on-one. And we will see that each Mass allows us to 'share our pew' with loved ones who have gone on ahead of us.

We will then take a 'tour' of the Catholic chapel, showing how the furnishings, sacred vessels, and priestly vestments closely resemble what appeared in the Old Testament tabernacle and Temple. (This is why Jews who attend Mass with a Catholic friend are so often amazed at how familiar it all seems.)

Please join us as we complete our final class on Presence. We hope it will give you a better understanding of what you may have been missing!

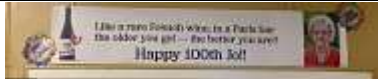
