Sacraments

Baptisms: Baptism preparation class is required for all parents and godparents, and they must be registered in a Catholic parish and members in good standing.

Contact the parish office to schedule an appointment.

Marriage: All engaged couples participate in a Marriage Preparation Program (a policy of the Diocese of Colorado Springs), Contact the parish office AT LEAST ONE YEAR IN ADVANCE of your planned marriage to begin preparation.

Sacrament of the Sick/Emergencies: Dial 633-2132, x1002. Calls are monitored on a regular basis.

Funerals: Please call the parish office **before** scheduling date and time with a funeral home. The parish office schedules presiders, musicians, and servers in consultation with family members.

Adult Catholic Studies

On **April 30th**, we will learn how Ephrem outsmarted heretics who had confused the Christians of Edessa.



We'll discover how art in the catacombs and in Ravenna taught the connection between OT types and NT fulfillments, in a time when there were few books and extensive illiteracy.

We'll learn about the 'discipline of the secret' so important before Constantine legalized Christianity.

We'll also see that, before Easter, those coming into the Church learned about the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and Salvation History...and between Easter and Pentecost, they learned that all was ordered to the Sacraments, where we get a taste of Heaven and the grace we need for earth.

On **May 7th**, we'll hear about St. Ambrose who, as governor of Milan, dealt with the serious division between Christians and heretical Arians. Thanks to his compassion and calm approach, both sides later acclaimed him bishop.

We'll get acquainted with St. John Chrysostom (whose nickname means 'golden-mouthed') who recognized that marriage was a dominant theme in Scripture; understood it could lead to holiness; and saw that the union of man and woman was an image of Christ's union with His Church.

We'll learn how Jesus used his experience on the Road to Emmaus to show us that all Scripture is ordered to the Mass and that the Liturgy's pattern moves us from the visible to the invisible, from the sign to the thing signified.

Finally, we'll see how Augustine's understanding of the unity between Scripture and Sacrament helped him refute the Manicheans, the Pelagians, and the Donatists.

Join us to learn about the powerful witness both the Bible and the earliest believers give to our Church. Find out how to better share these truths with non-Catholics who, through no fault of their own, don't yet understand.

Catholic FYI

Saint Narcissus of Jerusalem

Life in second- and third-century Jerusalem couldn't have been easy, but Saint Narcissus managed to live well beyond 100. Some even speculate he lived to 160.

Details of his life are sketchy, but there are many reports of his miracles. The miracle for which Narcissus is most remembered was turning water into oil for use in the church lamps on Holy Saturday when the deacons had forgotten to provide any.

We do know that Narcissus became bishop of Jerusalem in the late second century. He was known for his holiness, but there are hints that many people found him harsh and rigid in his efforts to impose Church discipline. One of his many detractors accused Narcissus of a serious crime at one point. Though the charges against him did not hold up, he used the occasion to retire from his role as bishop and live in solitude. His disappearance was so sudden and convincing that many people assumed he had actually died.

Several successors were appointed during his years in isolation. Finally, Narcissus reappeared in Jerusalem and was persuaded to resume his duties. By then he had reached an advanced age, so a younger bishop was brought in to assist him until his death.
