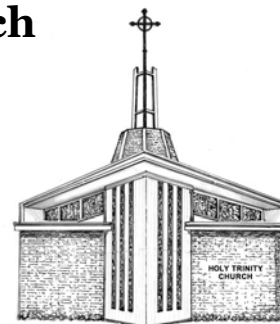

Catholic FYI

Sometimes there are things we hear in Church teaching that can be difficult to understand; we have not heard a good definition of them. One of these might be “intrinsic evil”. Here’s a great quote with a good definition. “...an intrinsic evil as an act that is always bad, always sinful, always, always, always. Never good, never appropriate, never useful, never, never, never. It is an act that is ALWAYS SINFUL in every time, every epoch, every era, every age, every place, every situation, every, every, every. There is NO GREY AREA! No doubt, no question that these acts (acts that are intrinsically evil) are always and everywhere and for everybody and for every situation, SINFUL and NEVER ACCEPTABLE.” <https://catholicparents.org/intrinsic-evil/>

Initiative 89, which would enshrine a “right” to abortion in the Colorado State Constitution and Senate Bill 24-068 fall in that intrinsic evil understanding. Initiative 89 would allow for tax payer funded abortions. SB 24-068 makes physician assisted suicide (PAS) easier.

A look at SB 24-068 summary (as introduced):

Advanced practice registered nurses will be able to assist in the suicide (presently it requires physicians).

A person no longer needs to be a Colorado resident.

Makes it possible to use federal money.

Reduces the wait time from 15 days to 48 hours.

This bill is an attempt to make it easier to murder those who are deemed undesirable (the terminally ill, the disabled, the depressed, the elderly, etc.).

We must work and pray to defeat this initiative that will allow for the murder of more babies, to stop the senate bill, and to repeal allowing assisted suicide in Colorado.

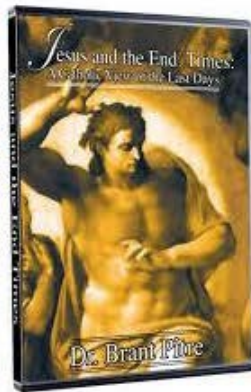
