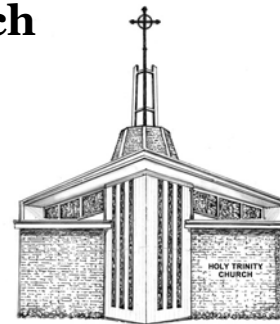

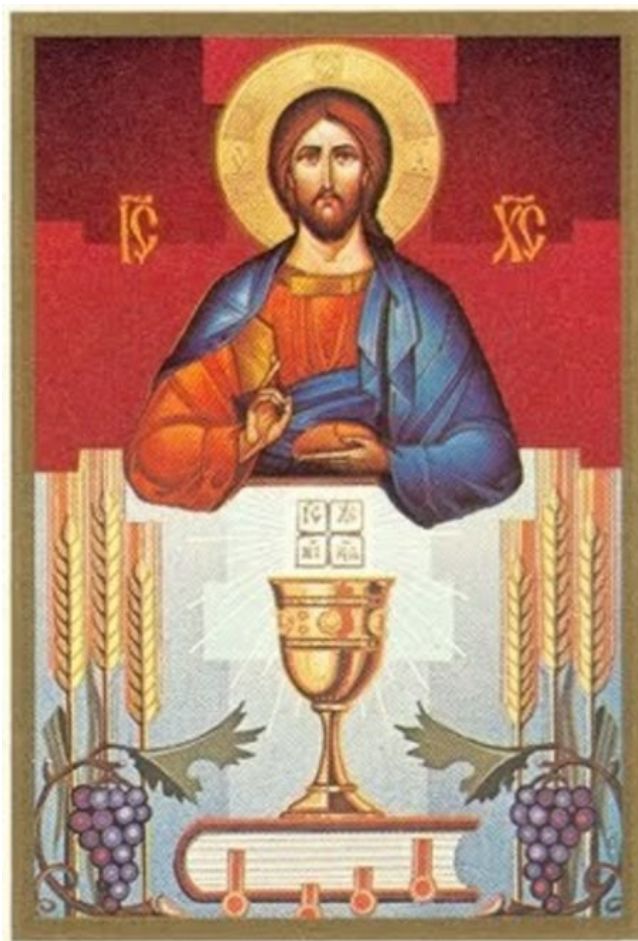

Holy Trinity Adult Catholic Studies Presents



Funeral Planning: The Final Journey Home: In this informative class, Deacon Pete McCann will guide you through some of the particulars of funeral planning. He will focus on practical things like estate planning, legal and tax issues, powers of attorney (POAs), wills, and advanced health-care directives. He will discuss preplanning, which includes selecting a funeral home and purchasing a burial or columbarium spot. He will prepare you to tell your loved ones when to call a priest and to explain to them the Catholic Funeral Liturgy you want. He will also explain the important Anointing of the Sick and the Last Rites (*Viaticum*).

Prayer For Beginners: Prayer is more important than eating, since the soul is more important than the body. In fact, saints are never made except by prayer...what Peter Kreeft calls “the hospital where we meet Dr. God!” This presentation is for anyone who isn’t good at prayer, finds it hard to pray, or makes excuses not to pray. We will look at steps to follow, words to use, and ways to ‘make it work.’ We will also learn the power of prayer – how even one moment of sincere prayer brings us closer to God than all the theology books in the world!



Consecration to St. Joseph: Fr. Don Calloway says God is telling His Church that, in these troubled times, we need to bring St. Joseph “onto the battleground.” To combat increasingly-intense spiritual warfare, the Church has done more to promote St. Joseph in the last 150 years than in the previous 1800! Join us as Father shares some of what he’s learned about our spiritual father from the wisdom of the saints, teachings of the popes, and reflections of the theologians.

Purgatory and Prayers for the Dead: Purgatory and praying for the dead are two misunderstood, controversial elements of our Faith. Most non-Catholics reject both, primarily because they reject key books of the Bible and cling to *sola scriptura*. In this video from his *Why We Believe* series, Dr. Brant Pitre discusses the biblical basis for, and compelling reasons behind, these consoling teachings.



Marriage: The Sacrament of Matrimony and the unity of the family are under relentless attack – and have been for centuries. Deacon Andy Dunnam will provide a look into the immense importance of Marriage Preparation and how we – as parents, relatives, and friends – can combat the current erosion of this divinely-established Covenant. Deacon Andy will also give insight into his role in the Diocesan Marriage Tribunal. That will include a crucial clarification that a Decree of Nullity is not a ‘Catholic divorce’ but a finding that a valid marriage never existed in the first place.
