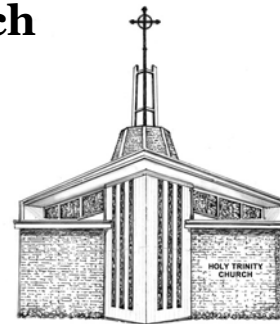

Sacraments

Marriage: All engaged couples participate in a Marriage Preparation Program (a policy of the Diocese of Colorado Springs), Contact the parish office AT LEAST ONE YEAR IN ADVANCE of your planned marriage to begin preparation.

Funerals: Please call the parish office **before** scheduling date and time with a funeral home. The parish office schedules presiders, musicians, and servers in consultation with family members.

Prayer: Into the Deep

While vocal prayer like the Rosary is good, the Doctors of the Church think it's not enough. For example, St. Teresa of Avila says, "If you do not practice mental prayer, you don't need any devil to throw you into hell; you throw yourself there of your own accord."

In this series, Avila Institute founder Dan Burke explains the foundations of prayer which he has taught to hundreds of seminarians and priests.

After distinguishing between the non-Christian East and Christian Theism and sharing key signs of false teaching, Burke tells us what mental prayer actually is...and then teaches us how to do it.

Catholic FYI

There have been 21 ecumenical or general councils of the bishops of the Catholic Church. The Eastern Orthodox Churches recognize the first seven of these councils as ecumenical councils.

A council is recognized as ecumenical once its works are approved by a pope.

1. Nicaea I held in 325 AD

Pope Sylvester I, 314-335 Emperor Constantine, 306-337
Decisions: Condemned Arianism, which denied the divinity of Christ (elements of Arianism have reappeared in our own time); defined the consubstantiality of the Father and the Son; fixed the date for Easter; began formulation of Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed.

2. Constantinople I held in 381 AD

Pope Damasus I, 366-384 Emperor Theodosius, 379-395
Decisions: Recondemned Arianism; condemned Macedonianism, which denied the divinity of the Holy Spirit; completed the formulation of the Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed.

3. Ephesus held in 431 AD

Pope Celestine I, 422-432 Emperor Theodosius II, 408-450
Decisions: Condemned Nestorianism, which denied the unity of the divine and human in Christ; defined that Mary is the Mother of God (Theotokos), a doctrine denied by the Nestorians and by most of today's Protestants; condemned Pelagianism, which held that man could earn his own salvation through his natural powers.

4. Chalcedon held in 451 AD

Pope Leo the Great, 440-461 Emperor Marcian, 450-457
Decisions: Condemned Monophysitism (also called Eutychianism), which denied Christ's human nature.

5. Constantinople II held in 553 AD

Pope Vigilius, 537-555 Emperor Justinian I, 527-565
Decisions: Condemned the Three Chapters, writings tainted by Nestorianism and composed by Theodore of Mopsuestia, Theodoret of Cyr, and Ibas of Edessa.

6. Constantinople III held in 680 AD

Pope Agatho, 678-681 Emperor Constantine IV, 668-685
Decisions: Condemned Monothelitism, which held Christ had but one will, the divine (this heresy arose as a reaction to the monophysite heresy); censured Pope Honorius I for a letter in which he made an ambiguous but not infallible statement about the unity of operations in Christ.

7. Nicaea II held in 787 AD

Pope Hadrian I, 772-795 Emperor Constantine VI, 780-797
Decisions: Condemned iconoclasm (which was mainly confined to the East), a heresy that held that the use of images constituted idolatry; condemned Adoptionism, which held that Christ was not the Son of God by nature but only by adoption, thereby denying the hypostatic union.

Discipleship

**Once one chooses to become a disciple of
Jesus Christ, stewardship is not an option.**

- Bishop John J. McRaith

This quote from Bishop McRaith is at the start of the Bishops' Letter, "Stewardship: A Disciple's Response." The pastoral letter challenges us to embrace stewardship as an expression of discipleship with the "power to change how we understand and live out our lives."

There is a fundamental obligation arising from the sacrament of baptism: that people place their gifts, their resources - their selves - at God's service in and through the Church. Here also Jesus is the model. Even though his perfect self-emptying is unique, it is within the power of disciples, and a duty, that they be generous stewards of the Church.
