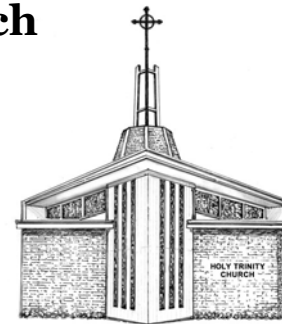

Sacraments

Funerals: Please call the parish office **before** scheduling date and time with a funeral home. The parish office schedules presiders, musicians, and servers in consultation with family members.

While vocal prayer like the Rosary is good, the Doctors of the Church think it's not enough. For example, St. Teresa of Avila says, "If you do not practice mental prayer, you don't need any devil to throw you into hell; you throw yourself there of your own accord."

Catholic FYI

Satan preys on both our weaknesses AND our strengths. He and his legions have been observing us from the crib, and they know all of our imperfections. Like a good military tactician, Satan will look for a weak point in our character, whether it be lust, greed, gluttony, envy, anger, pride, or sloth (the seven deadly sins), and then attack us with either a very likable person (who will lead us astray) or a worldly opportunity to try to make us fall. Usually, he won't do this when we are at our strongest, but rather, he will wait for a weak time in our lives, like a death in the family, a divorce, money problems, etc., to spring his trap. Like the old Mission Impossible series, Satan will set up a false reality to make us say and do things that we wouldn't ordinarily say or do. Satan's likable person will usually come out of nowhere, and will present a very pleasant appearance and personality. We, the victims, will feel really great when we are around them. However, the flip side of being around this person is that he/she will tempt us strongly to do something we know is wrong. We will always feel terrible and guilty when we are away from him/her. This is by design, so that we will want their company even more. An opportunity to get what we always wanted out of this life, get rich quick, getting even with someone, etc., and will usually be presented to us as the hook. **Only** the Christians truly grounded in scripture and the sacraments will be able to withstand this assault.
