

On the 800th anniversary of St. Francis of Assisi setting up the first Nativity scene, the creche in St. Peter's Square in 2023 will come from the Diocese of Rieti, Italy, and pay tribute to the scene set up in the diocese in 1223.

St. Francis' Nativity scene in a cave in Greccio featured live animals, but the one set to be unveiled in St. Peter's Square Dec. 9 will not, according to a press release from the Vatican City State governor's office.

Indulgence

Catholics will be able to receive a plenary indulgence from December 8, 2023, the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, to February 2nd, 2024, the feast of the Presentation in the Temple of Our Lard Jesus Christ, by praying before a Nativity scene in a Franciscan church.

This year marks the 800th anniversary of the first live Christmas crib and Nativity scene in the Italian town of Greccio, December 24th, 2023. In celebration and gratitude for this Christmas tradition for 800 years, the Church has granted to all Franciscan churches the wonderful grace of this indulgence. As a reminder, a plenary indulgence cleanses a person of all temporal punishment due to sin, under these conditions:

- 1.A detachment from all sin, including venial sin.
- 2.A visit to the Church (in this case the Nativity scene in a Franciscan church) with prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father.
- 3. Sacramental Confession and Holy Communion within 20 days before or after the visit.

The Catholic Center at the Citadel will have a nativity scene up from December 8, 2023 - February 2, 2024.

The indulgence also applies to visiting the nativity scenes at St. Francis of Assisi parish in Colorado Springs or Castle Rock.

The faithful are encouraged to do penance for the intention of the Church through fasting and prayer on the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday of Ember Weeks. 

Once one chooses to become a disciple of Jesus Christ, stewardship is not an option.

If we give God our energy, we give him back his own gift; if we give him our talents, our joys, and our possessions, we return to him that which he placed in our hands not as owners but as mere trustees.

- Archbishop Fulton Sheen

When people hear the word "stewardship," they often think it solely means tithing. We've even heard it described as "Father's hand in my pocket"! But stewardship is so much more. It is, fundamentally, an essential part of our call as disciples.
