## Sacraments

**Baptisms:** Baptism preparation class is required for all parents and godparents, and they must be registered in a Catholic parish and members in good standing. Contact the parish office to schedule an appointment.

**Marriage:** All engaged couples participate in a Marriage Preparation Program (a policy of the Diocese of Colorado Springs), Contact the parish office AT LEAST ONE YEAR IN ADVANCE of your planned marriage to begin preparation.

**Sacrament of the Sick/Emergencies:** Dial 633-2132, x1002. Calls are monitored on a regular basis.

**Funerals:** Please call the parish office **before** scheduling date and time with a funeral home. The parish office schedules presiders, musicians, and servers in consultation with family members.

## Adult Catholic Studies

On **December 18th** and **25th**, we will not have class.

On **January 8th**, we resume the wonderful Footprints of God series we've been sharing. In this episode, Steve Ray – who has led hundreds of pilgrimages to the Holy Land – focuses on places significant to Peter's story.

We first 'travel' to Bethsaida, where Peter and Andrew grew up. We then go to Capernaum, visiting the ancient White Synagogue as well as Peter's house, where the paralytic's friends lowered him through the roof. (We also get to see a 1st-century fishing boat discovered in the Sea of Galilee in the 1980s, after a terrible drought.)

The next site is the massive wall at Caesarea Philippi, which Jesus chose as the 'backdrop' when He proclaimed Simon as "the rock upon which I will build My Church."

Steve concludes our journey with stops at Mt. Tabor, where Christ was transfigured, and at Tabgha, where the resurrected Son of God fixed breakfast for His friends!

## Rocky Mountain March for Life

Rocky Mountain March for Life  
Civil Rights Begin in the Womb  
Monday, January 16, 2023  
9 AM to 1 PM, MLK Day

In January 2023, the center of focus for the Rocky Mountain pro-life movement will shift from the State Capitol to Colorado Springs. Respect Life Denver's decision to forego their annual January Celebrate Life March opens the door for pro-life witnesses to gather in Colorado Springs for the traditional MLK Rocky Mountain March for Life. The theme is 'Civil Rights Begin in the Womb'.

The day begins with a Rally on the Sidewalk near Planned Parenthood at 9 AM. (For parking if you intend to join the march, plan to arrive at Corpus Christi Catholic Church at 2318 N Cascade Avenue between 8 and 8:30 and ride the shuttle up to the sidewalk.)

In addition to prayers, the rally will include remarks by Catherine Wheeler, M.D. who performed abortions during her years of medical practice but had a profound conversion of heart and now speaks out as an advocate for the sanctity of all human life.

The March for LIFE will commence at 10 AM and will conclude at Corpus Christi Church where we will share more prayer, Catholic Mass, a pizza lunch, and fellowship.

## Catholic FYI

Right on the heels of Christmas, the Church gives us a trio of martyrs' feasts. First comes the feast of the first Christian martyr, St. Stephen, on December 26. This is followed on December 27 by the Feast of St. John the Evangelist (traditionally considered a “white martyr,” even though he died a natural death), and then on December 28, we remember the Feast of the Holy Innocents (the infant-martyrs killed by King Herod as he sought to destroy the Christ child).

What are we supposed to take away from this juxtaposition? Perhaps it is a good reminder that Christmas is more than soft pastels, stars, a cute baby, and Hallmark sentiments. We need Christmas—that is, we need the saving Christ—because we live in a dark and violent world. These feasts also remind us that following Christ means forfeiting our lives in one way or another. Christ has only just arrived on the scene, and already we are called to follow him.

### Feast of the Epiphany

Also known as Three King's Day, it marks the official end of the Christmas season for Catholics. It is a day where children throughout much of South America receive gifts. The holiday marks the adoration of the baby Jesus by the Magi. In the Gospel of Matthew, the men found the child by following a star for 12 days that led them to Bethlehem. The men - Melchior, Caspar and Balthazar - presented Jesus with three symbolic gifts. Those gifts - gold, frankincense and myrrh - are steeped in symbolism. The gold represents Jesus' standing as “King of the Jews”, while frankincense manifests the divine nature of His existence. Myrrh, often used to embalm corpses in ancient times, is a symbol of Jesus' mortality, a prelude to his death on Good Friday.

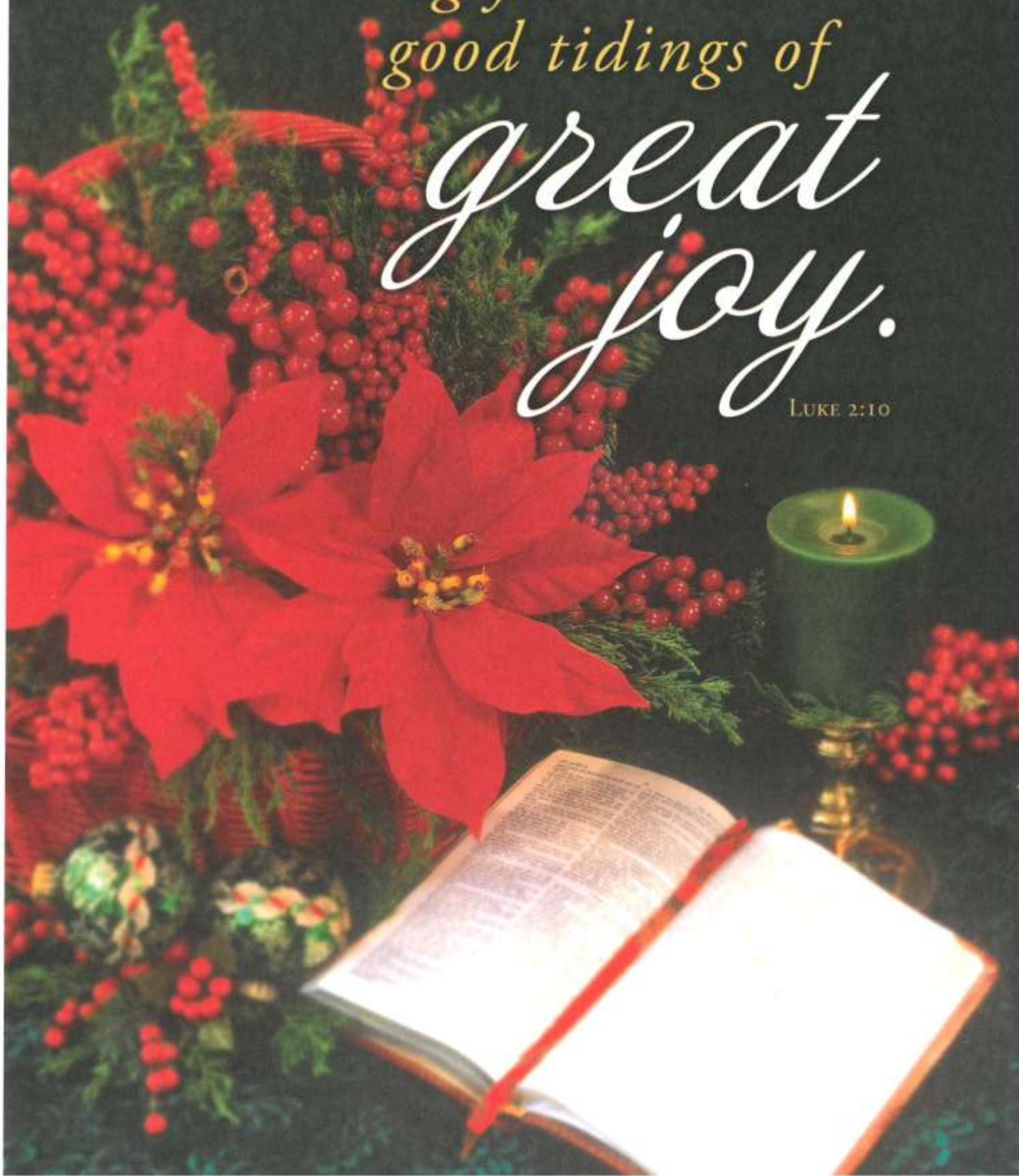

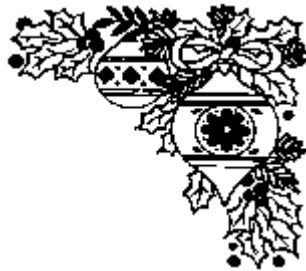
