



Angelina's six-mile trek for water doesn't end at a well or even a stream. Her journey takes her to a pit of sand. It's the dry season in Kenya, so the stream is dry. She and other women dig until they hit water, then scoop it into jerrycans to carry home. Angelina knows the murky water might make her children sick again. But this is the only drinking water they have. Your Lenten alms will help Church missions bring clean water and Christ's hope to villages in Africa.

Holy Trinity will be doing "Water for Life" for our almsgiving this year. Much more information will be available in the coming weeks. ## Sacraments FYI

**Family members or individuals** must call the parish to arrange sacraments like Anointing of the Sick, Baptism, or Confirmation because it allows the church to confirm eligibility, provide necessary preparation (catechesis), schedule the priest, record the event, and ensure proper spiritual support, especially for emergencies or homebound situations, linking the request to the parish's pastoral duty to its registered community.

## Ember Days

Ember Days are a traditional Catholic period of prayer, fasting, and partial abstinence occurring four times a year. They are designed to sanctify the new season, offer thanks for harvest, and atonement, specifically focusing on praying for vocations and ordained ministers. This year's Ember Days in February are the 25th, 27th and 28th. Please join us in prayer.

### FINDING HOPE IN GOD'S PROVIDENCE AND THE SHROUD OF TURIN

In *Foretold: Finding Hope in God's Providence*, Dr. Sean Innerst weaves together twelve pivotal Old and New Testament stories, showing how what was promised in the first part of our biblical history came to pass through Jesus, His apostles, and the Church. As he says, we can trust that the Divine Providence, so evident in Scripture, is also working in our lives today.

As we near the end of Lent, Connie Pratt will lead us in a study of the Shroud of Turin – the mysterious and miraculous linen relic many believe is Christ's burial and resurrection cloth. 
