

Adult Catholic Studies



On **February 23rd**, we will focus on St. Joseph who is, after Mary, the most powerful of saintly intercessors. Aware of the increasingly-intent spiritual warfare in our world, the Church, too, is focusing on St. Joseph. As Fr. Don Calloway says, we need to bring him “onto the battleground.”

In his book, *Consecration to St. Joseph*, Fr. Calloway shares a surprising amount of information about St. Joseph, who otherwise seems to blend into the background in Sacred Scripture.

Let Father introduce you to this silent saint, so you can better follow his humble lead. Join us as we learn from the wisdom of the saints, the teachings of the popes, and the reflections of the theologians.

On **March 2nd**, we will present Dr. Brant Pitre’s *Purgatory and Prayers for the Dead*. Purgatory and praying for the dead are two misunderstood, controversial elements of our Faith.

Interestingly, many Catholics do not fully understand the biblical and rational basis for either Purgatory or praying for the dead. And most non-Catholics reject both, primarily because they reject key books of the Bible and cling to sola scriptura. They dismiss the reality and reason for Purgatory. Sacred Scripture clearly points us to it – and the Church recognizes it as God’s last great act of mercy.

In this video from his *Why We Believe* series, Dr. Brant Pitre discusses the Biblical basis for, and compelling reasons behind, these consoling teachings. Join us as we learn what Purgatory is, why it exists, and how we can help hasten the journey to heaven for its many residents, including our deceased loved ones.

Feast of the Holy Face of Jesus

You are invited to celebrate the Feast of the Holy Face of Jesus with a Votive Mass with Bishop James Golka, Tuesday March 4th at 12:10 pm at St. Mary’s Cathedral.

It will be followed by a Holy Face Hour of Reparation, where the community prays together to make amends for our sins against Almighty God. An 1879 Veil of Veronica relic image sealed by Pope Leo XIII, will be available for veneration. The Holy Face Novena begins on February 23rd and helps prepare us for the Feast Day. The Holy Face Devotion was given by Jesus in the 1840’s to a Carmelite nun in France, to make reparation to the Triune God for blasphemy, as seen in disregard of the first three commandments. Jesus gifted her with the Golden Arrow Prayer of Praise, to counter these wounds. Immerse yourself in a Devotion that brought the Blessed Mother to La Salette, has the support of popes, the establishment of an Archconfraternity for all, the devoutness of many saints, including St Therese who added the Holy Face to her name. This Devotion is honorable, has produced many miracles, and is a remedy given to combat communism.

Holy Face images and information will be available at the Mass on the devotion, enlisting in Jesus’ 300 Holy Face Army, Holy Face Hour of Reparation, and the Holy Face Marian Pilgrimage of Reparation to France.

Jesus was the perfect teacher. He presents to His students, His primary lesson: “Do to others as you would have them do to you.” (Luke 6:31). Then He offers concrete examples to illustrate His point: “do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you, ... give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back.” (Luke 6:27-28; 30).

Jesus is calling on us to love as God loves, meaning, not just those who are easy to love but ALL people.
