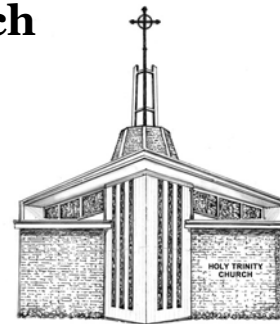

## Adult Catholic Studies



On **January 19th**, we'll be reminded that, of all the amazing wonders of creation, the most complex and mysterious are we humans. After all, we're the only ones who seek to know everything about everything ... and to know the God who made us.

We will learn that Genesis is not a science textbook which explains the how and when of Creation. It focuses instead on the Who and why. In so doing, this first book of the Bible answers key questions: who are we, why are we here, what's wrong with the world, and what's the solution to it.

Genesis also shows us that, contrary to pagan creation myths, God is intelligent, loving, free. And since He made us in His image, we too are capable of self-knowledge, self-possession, and self-gift.

On **January 26th**, we begin at St. Augustine, Florida, the oldest Catholic settlement in America, and ask what it was about Jesus that prompted faithful Catholics to cross the Atlantic to get there. We learn that committed missionaries wanted to gather scattered people in need of God's mercy.

Through the Fall, mankind had come under sentence of death and was in desperate need of redemption from sin. But immediately after the Fall, God, in His Providence (directing everything to His loving purpose) promised a Savior...and began the work of drawing good out of evil.

From then until now, God has used seemingly insignificant people to help Him fulfill His promises. We need to know He has a mission for us, too.

# Discipleship

The word "steward" (or "stewardship") is found 87 times in the New Testament. For example, Paul speaks of himself as a "steward" of the Gospel. He has received the "good news" from the Lord, and it has been given to him so that he can share it with others. In two passages of Luke's Gospel, it is even on the lips of Jesus.

New Testament writers use the words "steward" and "stewardship" to make the point that all people are God's stewards, because everything that exists belongs to God.
