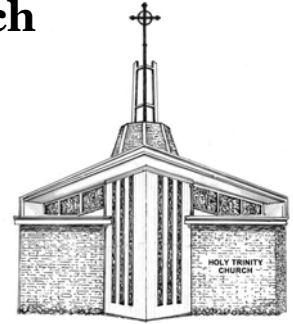

Adult Catholic Studies



On **January 26th**, we begin at St. Augustine, Florida, the oldest Catholic settlement in America, and ask what it was about Jesus that prompted faithful Catholics to cross the Atlantic to get there. We learn that committed missionaries wanted to gather scattered people in need of God's mercy.

Through the Fall, mankind had come under sentence of death and was in desperate need of redemption from sin. But immediately after the Fall, God, in His Providence (directing everything to His loving purpose) promised a Savior...and began the work of drawing good out of evil.

From then until now, God has used seemingly insignificant people to help Him fulfill His promises. We need to know He has a mission for us, too.

On **February 9th**, Deacon Andy Dunnam will present how the Sacrament of Matrimony and the unity of the family are under relentless attack – and have been for centuries. He will provide a look into the immense importance of Marriage Preparation and how we – as parents, relatives, and friends – can combat the current erosion of this divinely-established Covenant. Deacon Andy will also give insight into his new role in the Diocesan Marriage Tribunal. He will emphasize a crucial clarification that a Decree of Nullity is not a 'Catholic divorce' but a finding that a valid marriage never existed in the first place.

FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTION

FEBRUARY 1

First Saturdays at Holy Trinity

MASS 10:00 am*

Confessions 10:30 - 11:15am*

The Five First Saturdays devotion is one of the principal points of the Fatima message. It centers on the urgent need for mankind to offer reparation and expiate for the many injuries that the Immaculate Heart of Mary suffers from the hands of both impious and indifferent men.

For five consecutive first Saturdays of the month and with the intention of making reparation for the offenses against the Immaculate Heart of Mary, we are asked to:

- 1 – Go to Confession (may be 8 days before or after, if you are in a state of grace).
- 2 – Receive Holy Communion (can be received at a Saturday evening anticipatory Mass).
- 3 – Pray five decades of the Rosary.
- 4 – Keep Our Lady company for 15 minutes while meditating on one or more of the mysteries of the Rosary.

Our Lord told Sister Lucia that there are five ways that people offend and blaspheme against the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

- 1 – Offenses against Our Lady's Immaculate Conception – by denial or ridicule.
- 2 – Offenses against Our Lady's Perpetual Virginity.
- 3 – Offenses against Our Lady's Divine Maternity, refusing to accept her as the Mother of all mankind.
- 4 – Those who implant in children's hearts, indifference, contempt and even hate against this Immaculate Mother.
- 5 – Insults directed against her sacred images – ridicule and the infliction of damage to them.

The Promise

Our Lady promised to assist all those who will practice the devotion of the first Saturday on five consecutive months with the graces necessary for salvation at the hour of their death.
