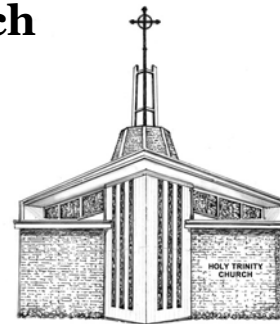

REFRESH YOUR FAITH!!!



On **January 28th**, we will complete our study of the Sacraments of Initiation with the Eucharist – “the source and summit of the Christian life.” [CCC 1324] We will explore the typology (foreshadowing) of the Eucharist in the Old Testament; the Eucharist’s role in God’s Plan of Salvation; and the doctrines of the Real Presence and Transubstantiation. We will also discuss why Holy Communion is limited to Catholics...and only those Catholics who are in the state of grace.

On **February 4th**, we will explore the characteristics and reality of the Mass. We will learn about the furniture and fixtures in our churches; see the symbolism of the priestly vestments; and realize the Liturgies of the Word and Eucharist perfectly worship God. We will be reminded that the Consecration re-presents Christ’s once-for-all-time sacrifice. And we will discover that, at Mass, the veil between heaven and earth is lifted and we are united with that “great cloud of witnesses,” all the angels and saints.

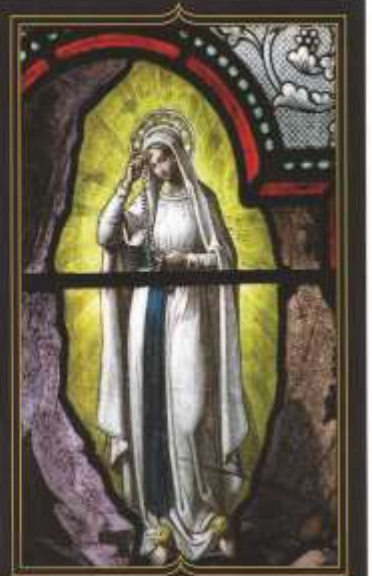

Diocesan Ministry Appeal

Today's Gospel states that Jesus *"taught as one having authority, and not as the scribes"* (Mark 1:22). He proved his authority with accompanying signs, such as casting out a demon. The people were astonished.

Adult Catholic Studies



On **January 28th**, we see Jesus summoning John to Heaven where God, enthroned, is being worshiped. John's witness of the heavenly liturgy inspired the celebration of the Mass in the early Church.

John sees the slain Lamb through whom God's plan of salvation will be revealed and accomplished. He also senses that no one is worthy to open the scroll of God's plan, sealed with seven seals. But John is about to see "what is to take place hereafter." The Scroll with its seven seals usher in the 1st Judgment.

On **February 4th**, we encounter the seven angels who prepare to blow their trumpets to usher in the 2nd Judgment. Many of the curses imposed on the sinful resemble the plagues that were inflicted on Egypt. The first four Trumpets depict events that are grave disruptions of nature afflicting all of mankind. Mankind is then warned of three Woes that are to come. The 5th and 6th Trumpets bring forth armies of strange, demonic creatures that afflict unrepentant mankind. The 6th Trumpet ushers in an interlude.

Catholic FYI

Saint Blaise was the bishop of Sebastea and a doctor. The first known record of the saint's life comes from the medical writings of Aëtius Amidenus, where he is recorded as helping with patients suffering from objects stuck in their throat. Many of the miraculous aspects of St. Blaise's life are written of 400 years after his martyrdom in the "Acts of St. Blaise."



Saint Blaise is believed to begin as a healer then, eventually, became a "physician of souls." He then retired to a cave, where he remained in prayer. People often turned to Saint Blaise for healing miracles.

In 316, the governor of Cappadocia and of Lesser Armenia, Agricola, arrested then-bishop Blaise for being a Christian. On their way to the jail, a woman set her only son, who was choking to death on a fish bone, at his feet.

Blaise cured the child, and though Agricola was amazed, he could not get Blaise to renounce his faith. Therefore, Agricola beat Blaise with a stick and tore at his flesh with iron combs before beheading him.

St. Blaise is also venerated as one of the "Fourteen Holy Helpers," a group of saints invoked as early as the 12th century in Germany and who are honored on August 8: St. Denis of Paris (headache and rabies), St. Erasmus or Elmo (colic and cramp), St. Blaise (throat ailments), St. Barbara (lightning, fire, explosion, and sudden and unprepared death), St. Margaret (possession and pregnancy), St. Catherine of Alexandria (philosophers and students, and wheelwrights), St. George (protector of soldiers), Sts. Achatius and Eustace (hunters), St. Pantaleon (tuberculosis), St. Giles (epilepsy, insanity, and sterility), St. Cyriac (demonic possession), St. Vitus (epilepsy), and St. Christopher (travelers). The German Dominicans promoted this veneration, particularly at the Church of St. Blaise in Regensburg (c. 1320).

Indulgence

Catholics will be able to receive a plenary indulgence through February 2nd, 2024, the feast of the Presentation in the Temple of Our Lord Jesus Christ, by praying before a Nativity scene in a Franciscan church.

This year marks the 800th anniversary of the first live Christmas crib and Nativity scene in the Italian town of Greccio, December 24th, 2023. In celebration and gratitude for this Christmas tradition for 800 years, the Church has granted to all Franciscan churches the wonderful grace of this indulgence. As a reminder, a plenary indulgence cleanses a person of all temporal punishment due to sin, under these conditions:

1. A detachment from all sin, including venial sin.
2. A visit to the Church (in this case the Nativity scene in a Franciscan church) with prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father.
3. Sacramental Confession and Holy Communion within 20 days before or after the visit.

The Catholic Center at the Citadel will have a nativity scene up until - February 2, 2024.

The indulgence also applies to visiting the nativity scenes at St. Francis of Assisi parish in Colorado Springs or Castle Rock.
