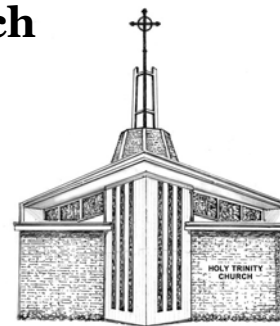

On **January 5th**, we will begin the Augustine Institute's foundational Faith of the Church series. Guided by the Creed, this beautiful program explores everything from the Sacraments to stories of the saints, all of which will inspire and empower you to understand, live, and confidently share your faith.

This first episode, Seeking the Face of God, reminds us that the One who spoke everything into existence never takes His loving eyes off us. He has made us in His image and likeness and built into us the desire to seek and know Him...and love Him in return.

We are reminded that our search for the answers to life's key questions begins with inward reflection on our soul, intellect, and will. We then look outside ourselves, to some notion of religion.

On **January 12th**, we are reminded, as Psalm 19 and St. Paul in Romans 1 affirm, that God's existence can be known through observation of the world He established all around us. Perfectly happy in Himself, God nevertheless lovingly chose to create us. He also lovingly chose to make us His sons and daughters through a series of covenants.

We first approach God through our senses. Through our senses, we inform our mind and intellect. And through our mind and intellect, we nurture the faith which recognizes Him as Creator and Father. In short, reason only begins our journey toward God. We need to go beyond that to reach our final destination, the Beatific Vision in Heaven.

A Free Lecture by Professor Fr. Andrew Dalton, L.C.

Where Science Meets Faith



Fr. Andrew Dalton is a Catholic Priest of the Legionaries of Christ and an international Shroud speaker. He is a Professor of Theology at the Pontifical University Regina Apostolorum in Rome where he teaches Biblical Theology of the Passion of Christ. Fr. Dalton is also a Board member of Oshemia, an international organization that educates the public about the Shroud of Turin.

The Shroud of Turin is a 14-foot linen cloth historically revered as the burial shroud of Jesus Christ. As the most studied artifact in human history, it bears an anatomically perfect image of a man which has not been successfully replicated or fully explained by science to this day.
