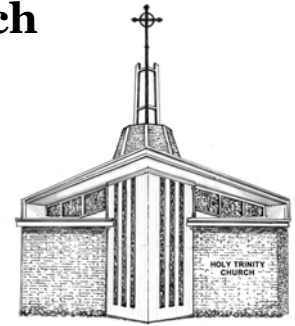

On **January 7th**, we begin our new year with a class on our Blessed Mother and the Communion of Saints, that “great cloud of witnesses” surrounding us. We will help you more effectively explain what Catholics really believe about the Saints, in general, and Mary, in particular. We will look at the four Marian dogmas; cite their foundations in Scripture and Tradition; and suggest ways to reply to common objections.

On **January 14th**, we will discuss Salvation, Purgatory, and the flawed Rapture Theory. We will learn the Catholic distinctions between redemption, sanctification, and salvation; see that purgatory, a cleansing waystation or heavenly anteroom, has biblical roots and is God’s wonderful gift of mercy; and contrast Biblical teaching on faith and works with Luther’s misunderstanding of them.

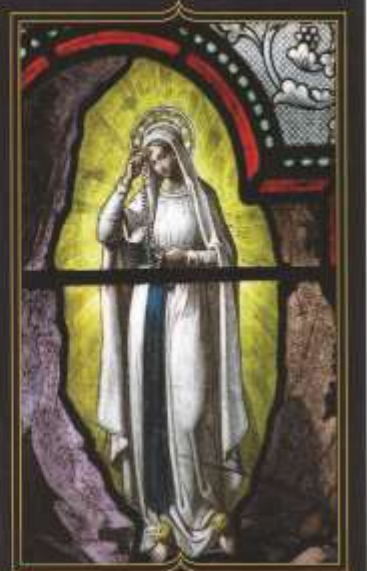

Disalced Carmelites Secular Order

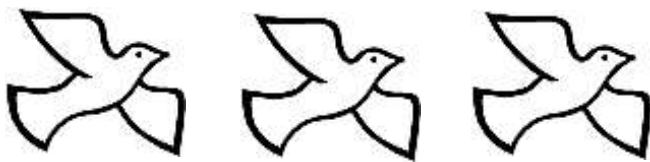

Sprawling over just 100 acres, Vatican City is the smallest country in the world. This region was a part of Rome for the longest time (200 years to be precise) but it gained independence in 1929 and since then been governed as an absolute monarchy with the pope being the head. Covering approximately one-eighth the size of the NY Central Park - you can explore this country within just a few hours. The best part? You don't even need a visa!

Vatican Timeline:

1506: The cornerstone of St. Peter's Basilica (one of the most important pilgrimage sites and one of the world's largest buildings) is laid.

1512: Michelangelo's paintings on the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel are completed and exhibited to the public for the first time.

1626: St. Peter's Basilica, the largest church in the world, was built.

1929: The Lateran Treaty was signed between Pope Pius XI and Italian leader Benito Mussolini declaring Vatican City as an independent state that became the world's smallest country.

1929: The independent state of the Vatican comes into existence.

Indulgence

Catholics will be able to receive a plenary indulgence from December 8, 2023, the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, to February 2nd, 2024, the feast of the Presentation in the Temple of Our Lord Jesus Christ, by praying before a Nativity scene in a Franciscan church.

This year marks the 800th anniversary of the first live Christmas crib and Nativity scene in the Italian town of Greccio, December 24th, 2023. In celebration and gratitude for this Christmas tradition for 800 years, the Church has granted to all Franciscan churches the wonderful grace of this indulgence. As a reminder, a plenary indulgence cleanses a person of all temporal punishment due to sin, under these conditions:

1. A detachment from all sin, including venial sin.
2. A visit to the Church (in this case the Nativity scene in a Franciscan church) with prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father.
3. Sacramental Confession and Holy Communion within 20 days before or after the visit.

The Catholic Center at the Citadel will have a nativity scene up from December 8, 2023 - February 2, 2024.

The indulgence also applies to visiting the nativity scenes at St. Francis of Assisi parish in Colorado Springs or Castle Rock.

The Revelation to John

The Book of Revelation is one of Scripture's most misunderstood, misinterpreted, and puzzling books.

Its bizarre imagery and unfamiliar symbolism conjure wild speculation, especially about the End Times foretold by Christ in Matthew and described by Paul in his letters to the Thessalonians.

While written in an apocalyptic style, it is not all doom-and-gloom. It is actually about Satan's final defeat and the arrival of God's kingdom.
