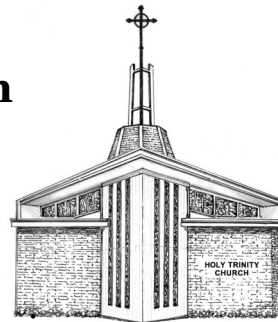

Catholics from across Colorado are invited to participate in the Catholic Heartland Pilgrimage, a unique 12-day spiritual journey through Illinois and Missouri from September 16–27, 2026.

This pilgrimage has been prayerfully designed to help pilgrims deepen their faith while exploring the life and legacy of Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen and many of the places that shaped Catholic history in America's heartland.

Pilgrims will visit significant Catholic sites connected with Archbishop Sheen, Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne, Saint Louis Abbey, the National Shrine of Our Lady of the Snows, the Cathedral Basilica of Saint Louis, the Shrine of Saint Joseph, and other sacred places that reflect the rich heritage of the Catholic faith in the United States.

The pilgrimage will culminate with participation in the historic Beatification of Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen in St. Louis, one of the most significant Catholic events in America in 2026.

Designed as a true pilgrimage rather than a sightseeing tour, the journey emphasizes prayer, fellowship, spiritual reflection, and a deeper encounter with Christ while traveling with a small community of fellow Catholics. Participation is intentionally limited to approximately 23–25 pilgrims to foster a more personal and prayerful experience.
