Baptismal Records

An "original" baptismal record is required within six months of a sacrament. This can be confusing, since it sounds like the certificate is the one received at baptism. 'Original' is one that is current and has a seal on it from the parish in which you were baptized. These certificates are necessary for any additional sacraments and if you become a sponsor or Godparent.

According to Canon 535 §1-2: Each parish must maintain a baptismal register, which is a permanent record. These records are to be carefully preserved, and entries should include not only the baptism but also notations of other sacraments or significant canonical acts (e.g., confirmation, marriage, holy orders, or annulments) as they occur.

*Repeated sacraments, such as First Communion or Confession are not required, but are many times put in the register and annotated on the certificate.

Sacraments Listed on a Baptismal Certificate A baptismal certificate primarily records the details of the baptism itself, as outlined in Canon 877. However, because the baptismal register serves as the central record of a person's sacramental life in the Church, notations of other sacraments or canonical acts are included on an updated baptismal certificate. These may include:

Confirmation: Noted when the sacrament is received, per Canon 895, which requires the confirmation to be recorded in the parish baptismal register.

Marriage: Recorded in the baptismal register when a person marries in the Church (Canon 1121-1122). This includes notations of canonical form or dispensations.

Holy Orders: If the person is ordained, this is noted in the baptismal register (Canon 1053).

Annulments or Dissolutions: If a marriage is annulled or dissolved, this is recorded.

Profession of Vows: For those entering religious life, a profession of vows is noted.

Change of Rite or Other Canonical Acts: If a person changes their rite (e.g., from Latin to Eastern Catholic, which you can only go one way, not returning) or other significant canonical events occur, these are also recorded.
