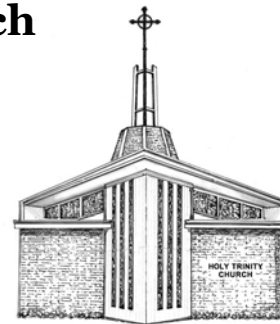

Sacraments

Baptisms: Baptism preparation class is required for all parents and godparents, and they must be registered in a Catholic parish and members in good standing.

Contact the parish office to schedule an appointment.

Marriage: All engaged couples participate in a Marriage Preparation Program (a policy of the Diocese of Colorado Springs), Contact the parish office AT LEAST ONE YEAR IN ADVANCE of your planned marriage to begin preparation.

Sacrament of the Sick/Emergencies: Dial 633-2132, x1002. Calls are monitored on a regular basis.

Funerals: Please call the parish office **before** scheduling date and time with a funeral home. The parish office schedules presiders, musicians, and servers in consultation with family members.

Sister Mary Wilhelmina Lancaster

While in the Midwest to visit family, Chuck and Susan Pavlica made a pilgrimage on June 6 to a monastery north of the small town of Gower, MO. They viewed the exhumed body of Sister Mary Wilhelmina Lancaster, foundress of the Benedictines of Mary, Queen of Apostles Monastery. Although her remains are now encased in a glass shrine, they are still clearly visible. Her body is incorrupt, and the habit she is wearing is clean and looks freshly pressed, even though the lid of the plain pine box in which she was buried (in 2019) was damaged. Sacred Heart of Jesus

One of the most famous Eucharistic Miracles is the miracle of Lanciano, Italy. In the year 750 in the Church of St. Francis, a host turned to flesh during the consecration at Mass. To this day, that Host is intact and kept in a reliquary in Italy.

In 1970, the Archbishop of Lanciano ordered a scientific study of the relic. Dr. Edward Linoli, a professor of anatomy, histology, chemistry, and clinical microscopy studied the mysterious flesh, 1200 years after it appeared on an altar. On March 4, 1971, he released a detailed study that concluded the substance was authentic flesh consisting of muscular striated tissue of the myocardium, that is heart muscle.

In the 1990's a similar transformation of the Host occurred during Mass at a church in Argentina. The flesh was studied by a pathology lab with this result: This sample is a fragment of a human heart. There were many white blood cells. This means the heart was alive when the sample was taken. White blood cells will die without a living organism. In addition, the white blood cells penetrated the tissue. Therefore, the heart was under severe stress as if the owner was severely beaten.

What a powerful meditation this is for us as we approach the sacred Host, prepared to receive the tremendous gift of Jesus in the Eucharist, not a symbol, but His Real Presence.

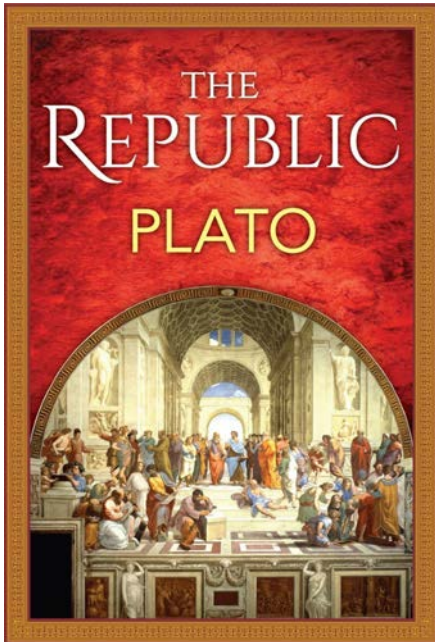
