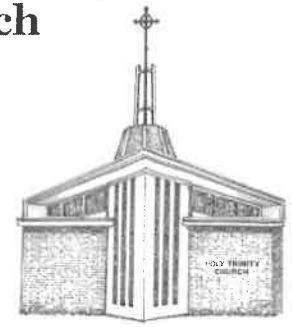

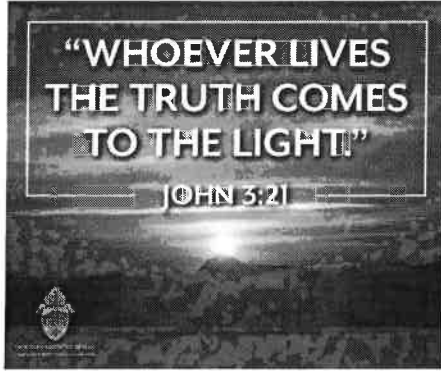

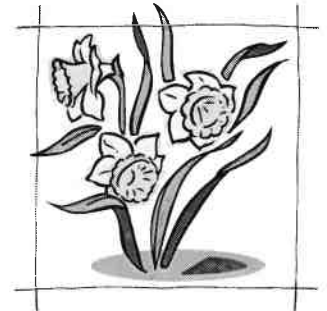

Wells of Salvation

Our Parish's Lenten Outreach

Lent is a season of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, a tradition that draws us closer to Christ as we unite in sacrifice. This Lent, we are joining Catholic parishes across the U.S. to drill and repair 109 hand pump wells in Zambia and Malawi in sub-Saharan Africa — blessing 49,000 people with safe, clean water.

When Happy Mhango's husband died unexpectedly in 2020, it felt like the world was collapsing around her. Suddenly, she had to find a way to provide for her four children. At the same time, she was suffering from terrible neck and shoulder pain caused by carrying heavy buckets of water from a distant river.

In these troubled times, Happy turned to Christ and his Church. Immediately, she found comfort and aid through her local Catholic community — neighbors who were poor themselves but willing to give what little they had to a family in greater need. Slowly, she began to smile again. Happy received her First Communion in 2021, and in October 2022 her faith was confirmed when her diocese built a village well just minutes from her home.

"My pain has disappeared!" Happy beamed. "Please give to help our friends who do not have water. The joy in our community is great, and we want others to experience the same joy."

As a parish family, we can extend similar blessings to families in Africa who thirst for a clean, safe drink — and the soul-transforming gift of Christ's living water.

Your compassion this Lent can change the lives of girls like Miriam Lungo, 13, who lives in Kwenje Village, Zambia. She wakes up before dawn every day to make the hourlong journey to fetch a bucket of murky, contaminated water, and she repeats the trip after school.


“When we are sick from the water, we miss school, so it makes it hard for us to achieve our dreams,” Miriam said. “I pray for a good life free from illness.”


Through our prayers, fasting and almsgiving, we can support Church-based ministries that need our help to meet these life-changing needs:

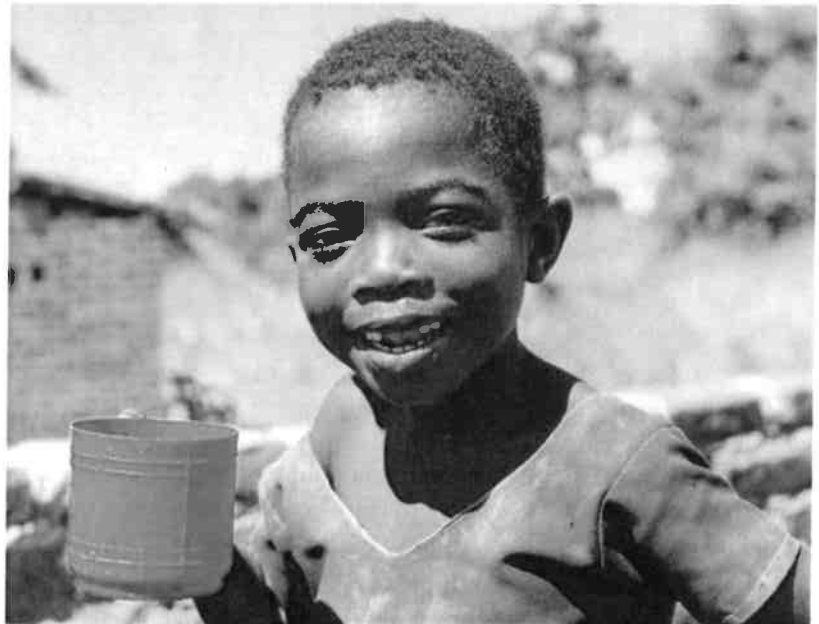
-  **WATER** Drill 104 hand pump wells and repair 5 more in Zambia and Malawi, bringing clean water to 49,000 people in more than 100 villages and one primary school.
-  **FOOD** Fill stomachs with more than 2.1 million protein-rich Vitafood meals in Zambia and Malawi and support nutrition programs for 500 families.
-  **HEALTH** Build an operating room at the St. Thomas Mission Hospital in Zambia, expand mobile medical clinics in Malawi, and support local medical staff salaries.

 **EDUCATION** Provide 40 children with secondary school scholarships and install a solar electric system at a primary school in Zambia.

 **AGRICULTURE** Provide seeds and training to 300 farmers in Zambia and Malawi.

 **MICROENTERPRISE** Launch village savings and lending associations for 50 families in Zambia and offer small-business training for 100 farming families in Malawi.

 **SPIRITUAL OUTREACH** Build a rural church and train catechists in Malawi. Reach 481 people in Zambia and Malawi with spiritual training and Catholic Bibles.
