

FINDING HOPE IN GOD'S PROVIDENCE AND THE SHROUD OF TURIN

In *Foretold: Finding Hope in God's Providence*, Dr. Sean Innerst weaves together twelve pivotal Old and New Testament stories, showing how what was promised in the first part of our biblical history came to pass through Jesus, His apostles, and the Church. As he says, we can trust that the Divine Providence, so evident in Scripture, is also working in our lives today.

As we near the end of Lent, Connie Pratt will lead us in a study of the Shroud of Turin – the mysterious and miraculous linen relic many believe is Christ's burial and resurrection cloth. After detailing problems with the Carbon-14 dating which supposedly disproved the Shroud's authenticity, we will explore compelling evidence from history, tradition, iconography, textile study, metallurgy, botany...and the Bible itself.

EPIC: A JOURNEY THROU CHURCH HISTORY

Steve Weidenkopf begins with a summary of the Protestant Revolt, highlights people like Queen Mary ('Bloody' Mary) and Queen Elizabeth ('Good' Queen Bess), and describes the consequences of that Revolt. He then explores the Church's response, the Catholic Reformation. In the final class, he discusses the secular roots of reason and the exclusion of God.

FUNERAL: PLANNING-THE FINAL JOURNEY HOME

Connie Pratt will address crucial issues (advanced directives, medical powers of attorney) and dangerous pressures we may face when we are most vulnerable.

Deacon Pete McCann will then focus on funeral prep: selecting funeral homes, cemetery/columbarium sites. He'll make suggestions for telling loved ones when to call a priest and making clear the Catholic Funeral Liturgy we want. He'll also explain Anointing of the Sick, Last Rites, and Apostolic Blessing.

Time and time again, we see examples of Jesus working miracles that demonstrate his identity as the long-awaited Messiah. This powerful passage cements Jesus' divinity. Yet, at the same time, it confirms that Christ is also human. He loves Lazarus, Mary, and Martha. Jesus weeps for the loss of his friend and is deeply touched by the sorrow Mary and Martha feel at the death of their brother. He experiences these very human emotions because he is fully human.

But he is also fully divine. He brings Lazarus back, from the death to life, from the darkness of the sealed tomb to the bright light of his family home and sisterly love. Christ's deep love for this family reflects God's love for us. It is personal. God is always present and wants to be part of our lives.

Lazarus' rising from the dead foreshadows Christ's resurrection. Death has no power; Jesus will be with us always. When he is born, he is called "Emmanuel," or "God is with us." When he visits the apostles the last time before ascending into heaven, he reminds them that he will be with them always, "even to the end of time" (Matthew 28:20). In times of darkness, we can be emissaries of this very real, very personal, love that Our Lord has for us. Water for Life

Alice's baby is with her wherever she goes — even on journeys to collect water. She carries little Patrick in a sling made from fabric. Once she reaches a small pond, Alice bends over carefully with Patrick on her back as she scoops water. Then she carries her water and Patrick back home. But she isn't done yet. Lovingly carrying Patrick again, she returns to the stream with the family's cattle. As she walks, she prays for clean water.

“Water for Life,” a program through Cross Catholic Outreach, builds new water systems to bring clean water to families like Alice's. One water system will serve 400 families, and all of your donations go directly to well-building. On the tables in the foyers, you can find boxes where you can save your coins as well as flyers with information on how to make a donation by check or credit card. Your Lenten alms will bring clean water — and good health — to villages in Africa. Donation envelopes can be found at both entrances to the church.


