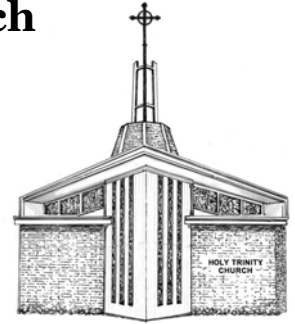

Adult Catholic Studies

On **March 16th**, Matthew begins with a focus on Edith Stein, the brilliant Jewish woman who, converted to Catholicism, was martyred at Auschwitz in 1942, and was canonized in 1998.

Matthew says it's through the Sacraments that God gives us the grace to become His sons and daughters. Blessed to be part of His Family, we unite with the Mystical Body of Christ, our true Brother, and receive the Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Next Matthew says the Liturgy is the summit toward which the Church's activity is directed. It announces the Scripture and then actualizes it. In short, it goes from the sign to the thing signified,

Matthew also explains that while Christ's power flows through the Sacraments, they're not 'magic tricks' to manipulate God. We must be properly disposed to receive sacramental grace.

On **March 23rd**, Mathew Leonard starts with Rudolf Hoss, the Auschwitz commandant who recognized the enormity of his crimes just before his execution and begged for a priest.

Reminding us we are all sinners, Matthew comments on the beauty of Reconciliation which allows even someone like Hoss to find peace.

Matthew discusses similarities and differences between the practice and effects of confession in the OT and in the NT. He also describes the Prodigal Son who disrespects his dad, abandons his family, wastes his inheritance, but eventually repents and returns.

Matthew warns us not to harshly judge that wayward son, since we sinners also walk away from our Father's house and waste His gifts. But in Confession, our Abba stretches out His arms, embraces us, and restores us to His family.

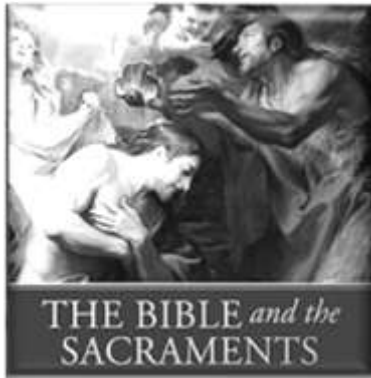

Lenten Thoughtfulness

This Lent, we have free post cards available to share with those who may not have been attending Mass or may need to hear that you are praying for them. Post cards are available on the tables by the bulletins.

Offer prayers and penances for a specific person. Plan ahead and put it on your daily calendar so you don't forget. Then, mail that person a beautiful postcard. Not only will this be incredibly touching, but this postcard can be hung on the fridge, added to a prayer card collection, or used as a bookmark.

Some Benefits:

Prayer: First, it encourages you to take the Lenten pillar of prayer even more seriously, focusing on how your prayer not only impacts your own spiritual life, but impacts the Body of Christ.

Companionship: Second, it allows you to become a sort of spiritual companion to another person on their own Lenten journey, particularly by letting them know that you are interceding for him or her on that day.

Promises: Finally, it gives you a chance to catch up on your 'I'll be praying for you' promises. It's easy to tell people that we are praying for them, but sometimes, our prayer for them just isn't as frequent or as deep as we would like it to be. Other times, we forget to pray altogether! This Lenten prayer activity changes that. You devote an entire day of spiritual focus — through prayer, but also sacrifice — to one person and their struggles, hopes, spiritual life, family relations, health, and whatever else that soul uniquely needs from you and your intercession."
