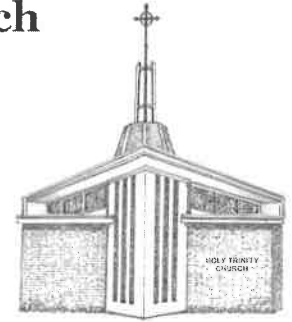

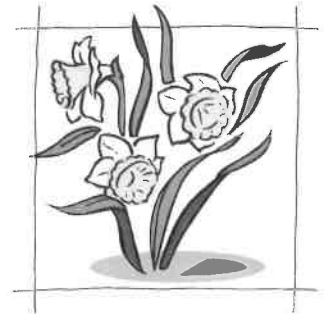

Walking with Moms in Need



The United States Bishops have asked Catholics to act in *radical solidarity* with pregnant women who need assistance. **Walking with Moms in Need** is a new ministry in which Catholic women accompany mothers facing an unexpected or otherwise difficult pregnancy. Volunteers called "angels" receive training from the Diocese of Colorado Springs on how to listen to a mom and then to provide practical advice and help, as well as spiritual support and Christian witness.

In our diocese, this ministry is partially modeled on the *Gabriel Project*, which was here at Holy Trinity 2010-18. In fact, the training materials the diocese uses were initially drafted by HT volunteers.

Parishes in Douglas County ("the northern deanery") are already helping moms; we have coordinators and angels in place in four parishes. We are planning additional trainings this spring and summer, and we hope to soon have volunteers in place at parishes here in Colorado Springs.

We ask that you **PRAY** for Walking with Moms in Need:

- *for the moms in need of help (that they will reach out and ask for it),
- *for the phone angels (who will be the moms' first point of contact),
- *for the angels (that the Holy Spirit will guide them as they help a mom), and
- *for our ministry (that we can effectively get the word out about this crucial apostolate and the services it provides).

Prayer cards are available on the tables at both entrances to the church.
