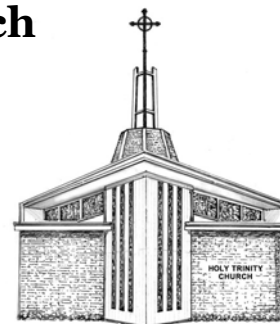

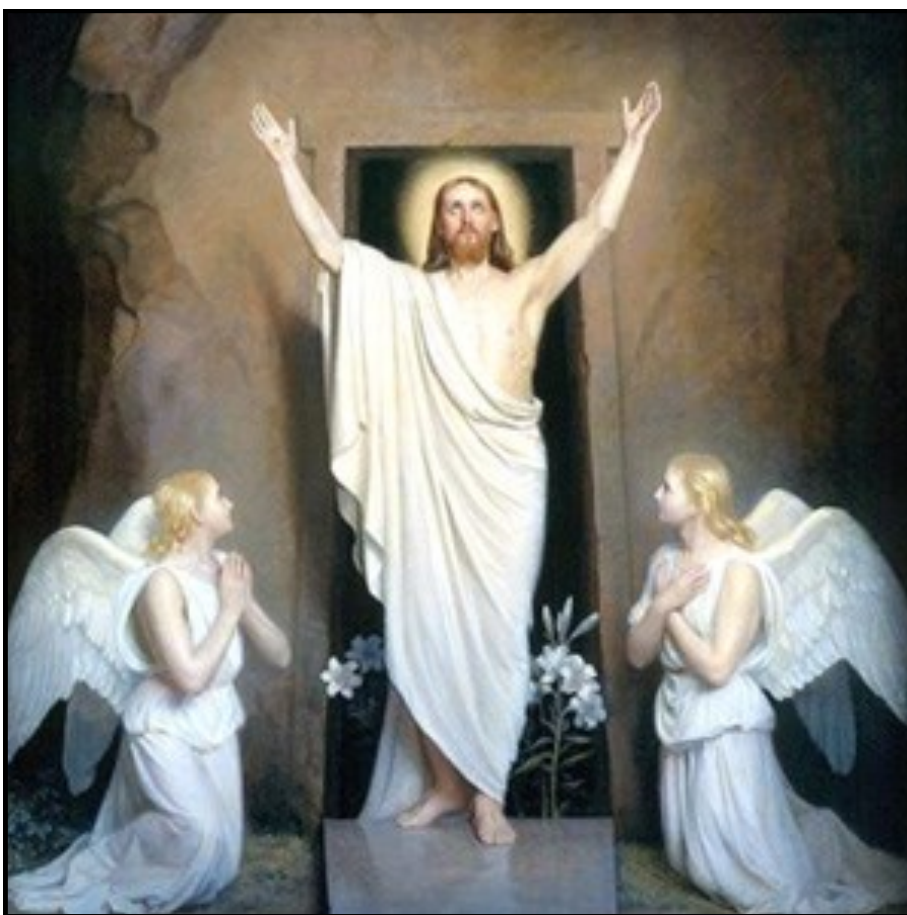

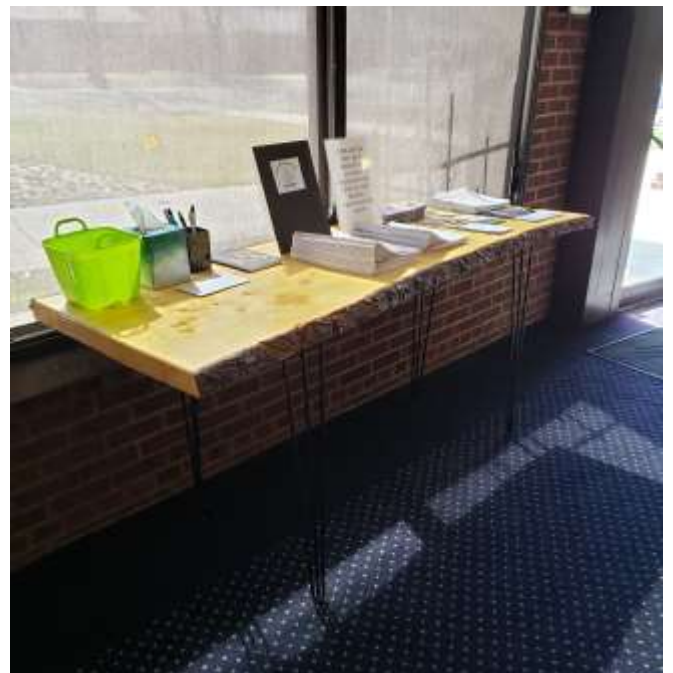

In this special class, Deacon Rick Athey, an experienced psychiatrist, will discuss the reality of Satan, the various means he can use to influence us, and the ways we can resist.

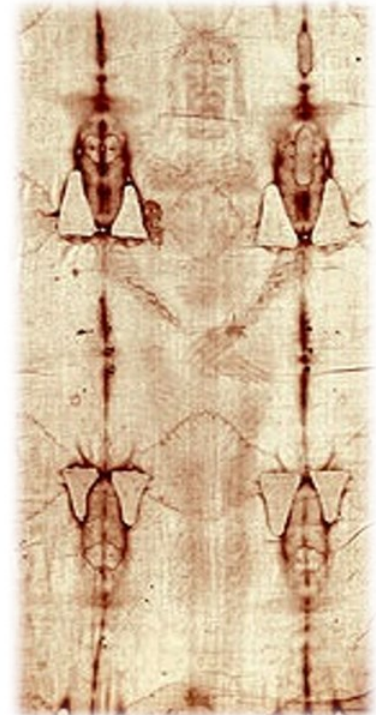
Deacon Rick will also explain what the exorcism team in our diocese does whenever it is contacted about possible demonic activity.

She will also share the Shroud of Turin Research Project's impressive findings about the image, the blood, and the wounds.


