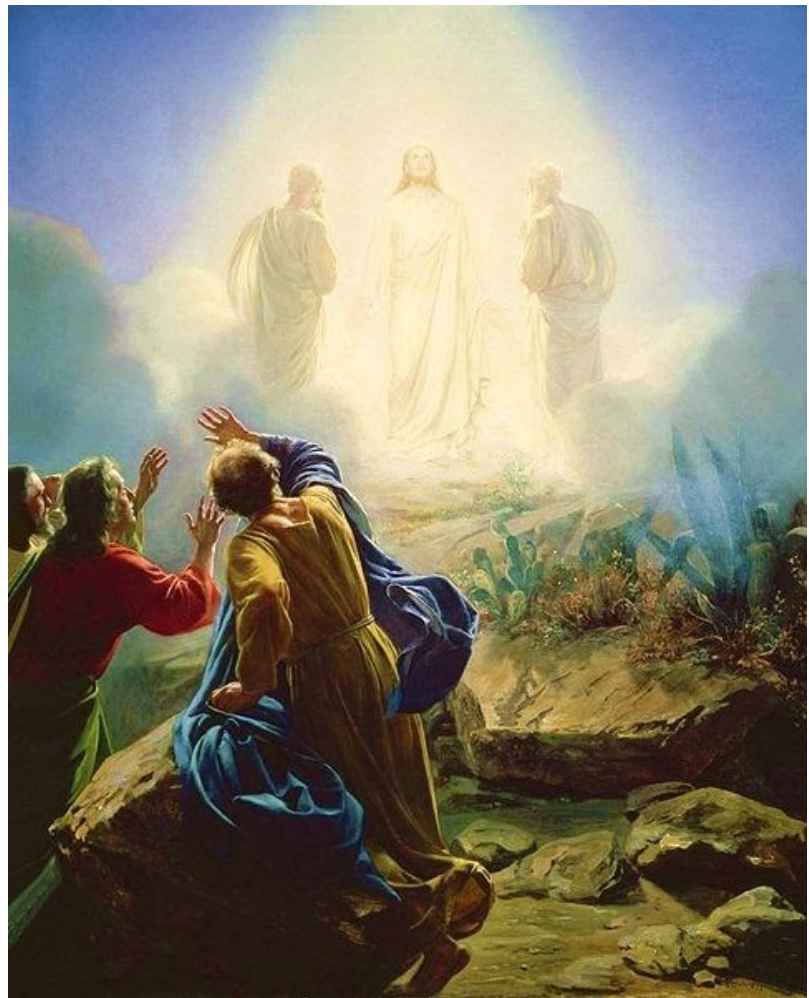

Sacraments

Baptisms: Baptism preparation class is required for all parents and godparents, and they must be registered in a Catholic parish and members in good standing. Contact the parish office to schedule an appointment.

Marriage: All engaged couples participate in a Marriage Preparation Program (a policy of the Diocese of Colorado Springs), Contact the parish office AT LEAST ONE YEAR IN ADVANCE of your planned marriage to begin preparation.

Sacrament of the Sick/Emergencies: Dial 633-2132, x1002. Calls are monitored on a regular basis.

Funerals: Please call the parish office **before** scheduling date and time with a funeral home. The parish office schedules presiders, musicians, and servers in consultation with family members.

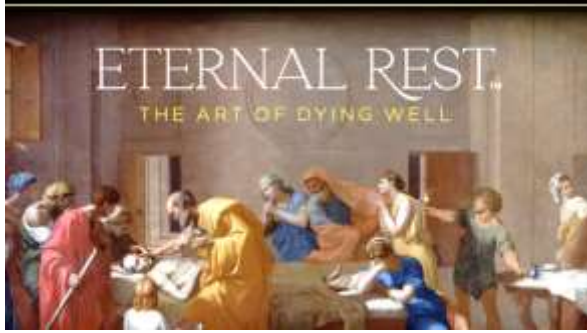

On **March 5th**, we will focus on The Afterlife, that instant when our minutes run out and we experience the Particular Judgment...seeing our entire lives and instantly realizing we will forever remain what we have become.

We will hear that all who end up in hell have chosen it for themselves...and that, because they closed themselves to God, their need for Him will eternally burn them.

We'll learn purgatory makes so much sense that, if it didn't exist, we'd have to invent it. We'll discover that its fire, unlike hell-fire, makes strong all in us that is good.

We'll ponder the moment Dante describes on his climb up Mt. Purgatorio, when he hears singing that grows ever louder and realizes it's the angelic chorus welcoming each soul as it steps into heaven. We'll realize that, since the Beatific Vision is infinite, we'll be able to enjoy it forever!

On **March 12th**, we'll focus on The Hour of Our Death, beginning with the Little Sisters of the Poor who, by 'keeping watch' with the dying, show us that, after baptism, death is the most significant moment in life.

We'll see how a memento mori reminds us to be ready for the day we die by being ready to die every single day.

We'll discover that our final suffering is a vocation, a call to pray with our body, make a sacrificial act of love.

We'll conclude with Last Rites, the final 'rung' on the ladder up to God. We'll walk through the process, seeing the three elements paralleling the Sacraments of Initiation. We'll be reminded that Viaticum, bread for the journey, nourishes us as we near the door of death. And we'll hear the beautiful Commendation: "Go forth, Christian soul..."

Catholic FYI

The Paschal candle is one of the most sacred and enduring elements in Christianity. Made of beeswax to represent the purity of Christ, the candle’s wick signifies Christ’s humanity, and the flame His Divine Nature. It is adorned with one or more Christian symbols, often the cross to represent His redemptive sacrifice; the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet - Alpha and Omega – to signify that He is the beginning and the end; symbols of wheat and grapes, or a chalice and host, for the Eucharist - the true presence of Christ and our spiritual strength; the 12 Apostles – witnesses and scribes to the passion, death, resurrection and ascension of Christ; and other symbols such as the Good Shepherd, the Lamb, the Sacred Heart, and the Risen Christ.

The Paschal candle is a rich symbol of our faith. It reaches its pinnacle at Easter. Each year during the Easter Vigil service on Holy Saturday night, a fire is kindled in a metal bowl, called a brazier (bray’-zhur). From the brazier comes a “new” and blessed fire that lights the Paschal candle which is carried in procession into the dark church. The “new” fire serves as an image of the Resurrection. The candle, which represents Christ himself, is placed on a special Paschal candle stand near the altar. Five grains of incense are inserted into the candle to recall the aromatic spices that were used to prepare Christ’s body for the tomb, and the wounds in His hands, feet and side, which remained after His resurrection.

The Paschal candle remains in the Sanctuary on its special candle stand during the full 50 days of the Easter season, and is lit for liturgical services during that time. After Pentecost the candle will be placed next to the baptismal font. The candle is lit during all baptisms throughout the year, passing the light of Christ to each person baptized, starting with the Catechumens at the Easter Vigil service. The candle may also be used at funeral services, and placed next to the casket during a funeral Mass. At funeral services it is a reminder that the sacrament of Baptism is itself a death and resurrection in Christ, and testifies to Christian certainty in the resurrection of the dead and life with Christ in the world to come.

This candle, also called the Easter Candle, originated in the earliest days of Christianity, when evening prayer began with the lighting of a candle. This practice was probably inspired by the Jewish custom of lighting a lamp at the conclusion of the Sabbath. Historical references mention the Lucernarium, the evening prayer rite with which the early Christians began each Sunday vigil. The lighting of the candle dispelled the darkness and represented Christ – the Light of the World.

In a profound moment, Jesus offered a taste of His divinity to Peter, James, and John in the Gospel today. Jesus made known the glory He had with the Father before the world began. These three disciples were privileged to

witness the manifestation of the Transfiguration.

As powerful as the Transfiguration must have been (Peter was so awed, he didn't even know what he said), that encounter can't equal receiving the Eucharist! Receiving an image of God through one's eyes can't rival the privilege of taking God Himself into one's body through the Eucharist.

Lent 2023

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During this penitential season of Lent, we call to mind the horrific action the Colorado legislature took last year enshrining abortion into Colorado law. As people of faith, we are deeply saddened by this grave assault on the sanctity of unborn innocent life. We grieve for the many women who continue to be harmed by abortion, and we mourn the young lives lost due to the unjust and perverse Reproductive Health Equity Act (RHEA).

Governor Jared Polis signed this law on April 4th last year, just 13 days before Easter. In doing so, he made our state a destination for abortion tourism through all nine months of pregnancy. We must pray and ask God for His mercy. For this reason, I invite all the faithful to join me during the remainder of Lent in doing penance, giving alms, praying, and fasting. We must use these spiritual practices to make reparations for the great sin of abortion in our state.

We also renew our commitment to accompanying women and families in need. This work is more critical now, as the unborn have been stripped of their right to life and their mothers face the harmful lie that the death of their children is a solution to their struggles. In response to the passing of RHEA, we must step forward with open arms and effective resources to help women reject the "solution" of death and empower them to choose life for their children.

In the Diocese of Colorado Springs, we do this through the support provided by Catholic Charities of Central Colorado and pro-life pregnancy resource centers. In addition, our diocesan Respect Life Apostolate sponsors *Walking with Moms in Need (WWMIN)* - a ministry to help parishioners identify and create local resources that provide assistance to pregnant and parenting moms in need. Project Rachel is another important ministry for individuals who have been harmed by abortion. I urge you to please consider joining a WWMIN ministry at your parish or getting involved in other pro-life works of mercy in our diocese. We will continue our efforts to build a culture of life in which abortion is unthinkable, all families receive the support they need, and the dignity of all people is recognized. We do this with confidence in the ultimate victory of Christ, whose resurrection has defeated the powers of death.

Our Lady of Guadalupe, who carried the Savior in your womb, Patroness of our diocese and the pro-life movement, pray for us.

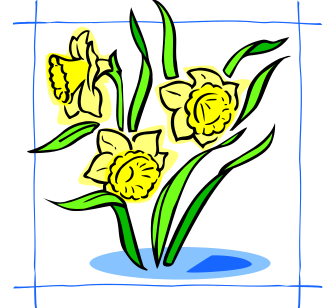

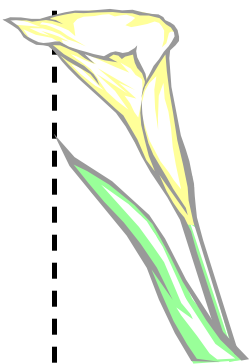
