



#### **Adult Catholic Studies**

On March 9th, we will begin our Lenten series: The Bible and the Sacraments and Divine Mercy.

In The Bible and the Sacraments, Matthew Leonard explores the deeper meaning and mystery of the sacraments – the "powers that come forth" from the



body of Christ. After discussing the origins of the sacraments so richly revealed in the Old and New Testaments, Leonard provides two additional classes on Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick.

In anticipation of Divine Mercy Sunday, we will discuss the devotions and the special indulgence which Jesus, our Divine Mercy, gave us through St. Faustina.

On **March 16th**, Matthew begins with a focus on Edith Stein, the brilliant Jewish woman who, converted to Catholicism, was martyred at Auschwitz in 1942, and was canonized in 1998.

Matthew says it's through the Sacraments that God gives us the grace to become His sons and daughters. Blessed to be part of His Family, we unite with the Mystical Body of Christ, our true brother, and receive the Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Next Matthew says the Liturgy is the summit toward which the Church's activity is directed. It announces the Scripture and then actualizes it. In short, it goes from the sign to the thing signified,

Matthew also explains that while Christ's power flows through the Sacraments, they're not 'magic tricks' to manipulate God. We must be properly disposed to receive sacramental grace.

Offer prayers and penances for a specific person. Plan ahead and put it on your daily calendar so you don't forget. Then, mail that person a beautiful postcard. Not only will this be incredibly touching, but this postcard can be hung on the fridge, added to a prayer card collection, or used as a bookmark.

#### **Some Benefits:**

**Prayer**: First, it encourages you to take the Lenten pillar of prayer even more seriously, focusing on how your prayer not only impacts your own spiritual life, but impacts the Body of Christ.

**Companionship:** Second, it allows you to become a sort of spiritual companion to another person on their own Lenten journey, particularly by letting them know that you are interceding for him or her on that day.

**Promises**: Finally, it gives you a chance to catch up on your 'I'll be praying for you' promises. It's easy to tell people that we are praying for them, but sometimes, our prayer for them just isn't as frequent or as deep as we would like it to be. Other times, we forget to pray altogether! This Lenten prayer activity changes that. You devote an entire day of spiritual focus — through prayer, but also sacrifice — to one person and their struggles, hopes, spiritual life, family relations, health, and whatever else that soul uniquely needs from you and your intercession."





# Join Our Parish's Lenten Almsgiving Project

The season of Lent challenges us to unite in sacrifice. It's a time to listen intently to Jesus' call on our lives and find ways to share his love in our hurting world. This Lent, our parish is joining Catholics across the U.S. to raise money for lifesaving water projects in Africa. # **Project Plan**

Our donations will set a series of steps in motion, resulting in safe, abundant water!

- 1. A local nomination process will be used to select villages with the greatest need for clean water. This often involves collaboration among Church leaders, village chiefs and medical professionals.
- 2. The land will be surveyed to determine the ideal location for a community water system.
- 3. Plans will be finalized based on local needs whether it's for a simple hand-pump community well or a solar-powered water tower.
- 4. A professional crew will drill to the proper depth, ensuring water will flow during the dry season.
- 5. Villages will elect a committee to oversee the care and sustainability of the water source, and families will be trained in sanitation and hygiene practices.
- **6.** Families will contribute a small payment to their local water committee to cover future maintenance needs, ensuring clean water will flow for many years to come.

# **Fasting During Lent**

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

#### Days of Penance

Can. 1249 The divine law binds all the Christian faithful to do penance each in his or her own way. In order for all to be united among themselves by some common observance of penance, however, penitential days are prescribed on which the Christian faithful devote themselves in a special way to prayer, perform works of piety and charity, and deny themselves by fulfilling their own obligations more faithfully and especially by observing fast and abstinence, according to the norm of the following canons.

Can. 1250 The penitential days and times in the universal Church are every Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent.

# Diocesan Ministry Appeal

The desert can be a place of dryness, of barrenness. Temptation is often strongest when we are weakest and in such a place as our own personal deserts. But God assures us that when we call, "He will answer" (Psalm 91:15), for "He will shelter you with His pinions, and under His wings you may take refuge" (Psalm 91: 4).

Jesus' temptation in the desert is yet another example of His willingness to suffer humility out of love for us. He serves as a model of what trust in God looks like. He overcomes Satan's false promises in the company of the Holy Spirit and with God's help. When we trust



in God and invite the Spirit into our lives, we seek to follow Christ's example. We then can be bearers of Christ's consolation to others, such as supporting the Diocesan Ministry Appeal, which brings His light and

protection and strength to those it serves.
