# Adult Catholic Studies

On **May 28th**, we present our last class before summer, an especially-beautiful episode, "Living the Mysteries."



We begin with St. Justin, who first tried to find peace in secular philosophies. But one day, an old man on the beach told him to seek

wisdom in the Hebrew prophets. Thanks to those writings and brave Christian witnesses, he converted... and was eventually martyred himself.

We learn Christians likened Jesus' total gift of self in the Eucharist to man's total gift of self in martyrdom, considering them, in a way, as private and public liturgies.

As Christianity spread, 'red' martyrdom decreased. But as St. Jerome said, "there is always martyrdom," the need to offer ourselves up to God.

In the Mass, there is an *anamnesis*, a 'making present,' of the crucifixion. And we, as Christ's brothers and sisters, are called to accept His Cross and our own quiet martyrdom. We are to place our lives on the altar. If we do so, we become "the Mass in motion." After all, by "living the mysteries" as the martyrs did, we are a kind of sacrament, a visible sign of who we are in Christ!

# Catholic FYI

June is the month dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Here are a few ideas to try during the upcoming month.

Start your day with this prayer: O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer You my prayers, works, joys and sufferings of this day for all the intentions of Your Sacred Heart, in union with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world, in reparation for my sins, for the intentions of all our associates, and in particular for the intentions of our Holy Father for this month.

Participate in a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration here at the parish on June 2, online, or on television as a way to honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus as present in the Eucharist. This is a great way to increase not only faith, hope and love ... but also peace, freedom from anxiety, and comfort in your own heart.

Set an alarm and at 3:00 pm, say the Divine Mercy Chaplet, a devotion inexorably linked to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, as it reminds us of the outpourings of Jesus' heart, with these words, "O blood and water which gushed forth from the heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in you."

Pray one of the many beautiful Sacred Heart prayers. As part of grace before meals you might try adding a brief but beautiful prayer such as the Prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, "O most holy heart of Jesus, fountain of every blessing, I adore you, I love you, and with lively sorrow for my sins I offer you this poor heart of mine. Make me humble, patient, pure, and wholly obedient to your will. Grant good Jesus, that I may live in you and for you. Protect me in the midst of danger. Comfort me in my afflictions. Give me health of body, assistance in my temporal needs, your blessing on all that I do, and the grace of a holy death. Amen " or say the Novena to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It was St. Padre Pio's go-to novena, as he recited it every day for those who requested his prayers.

# Lectors: Proclaimers of the Word of God



As a lector, we proclaim the Word of Sacred Scripture, not simply read it. To "proclaim" means to declare, to announce or to celebrate. In order for the Word to be proclaimed effectively, Lectors must study and reflect on that Word to allow the power of the passage to change their lives. "Readers" read well. Proclaimers have an understanding of what it is they read.

When scripture is read in church, God himself is speaking to his people. Lectors are called forth from among the community and are formed to proclaim the Word of God in such a way that it touches the hearts of the assembly and challenges them to live that Word.

Holy Trinity's lector ministry has no meetings, and only occasional trainings. The schedule is prepared three times a year. You can block out the dates you will be unavailable and then you are scheduled at

other times. Our lectors are also really good about trading and covering for each other
