

Adult Catholic Studies

On **May 7th**, we'll hear about St. Ambrose, the Milan governor who dealt with the division between Christians and heretical Arians. Thanks to his compassion and calm approach, both sides later acclaimed him bishop.



We'll get acquainted with John

Chrysostom ('golden-mouthed') who knew that marriage was a dominant Biblical theme; understood it was intended to lead to holiness; and saw that the union of man and woman was an image of Christ and His Church.

We'll learn how Jesus used his experience on the Road to Emmaus to show us that all Scripture is ordered to the Mass and that the Liturgy's pattern moves us from the visible to the invisible, from the sign to the thing signified.

Finally, we'll see how Augustine's understanding of the unity between Scripture and Sacrament helped him refute the Manicheans, the Pelagians, and the Donatists.

On **May 21st**, we'll meet Basil who, thanks to his 'Ivy League' education, became the doctrinal and theological expert for Bishop Eusebius and later succeeded him. We'll learn about the "new city" (hospital, soup kitchen, poor house, trade school, hospice) he set up to help the needy.

We'll find that John Chrysostom didn't just teach a theology on marriage but also condemned the sins which make us unworthy of the life flowing from that sacrament.

We'll hear about Nero, the murderous deviant who burned Rome but said the Christians caused it by their 'hate speech.' We'll learn about the martyrdom which followed...and see how these saintly people drew strength from, and identified with, the Eucharist as sacrifice.

Join us to learn about the powerful witness both the Bible and the earliest believers give to our Church. Find out how to better share these truths with non-Catholics who, through no fault of their own, don't yet understand.








Diocesan Ministry Appeal
