





Adult Catholic Studies



On **November 17th**, Steve focuses on the era when Christianity is fractured, and Protestantism begins. Steve provides details about Martin Luther, the first to leave the Church. He describes Luther's background, psychological make-up, sinful tendencies, and erroneous beliefs.

Steve also explains what Julius II, Leo X, and Charles V, to protect Catholics and the Mass, tried to persuade Luther to recant. When that failed, Luther was excommunicated.

After pointing out that a reformation seeks to return to something old while a revolution seeks to create something new, Steve makes it clear that the so-called Protestant Reformation was actually a revolution.

On **November 24th**, Steve ends his review of the era with a more detailed summary of the key protestors. He focuses on Luther, who opposed the Church and the papacy and attacked the Jews; Calvin, who systemized Protestant theology and spread it throughout Europe; Zwingli and the Anabaptists, who broke from Luther and Calvin; and Henry VIII, who left the Catholic Church to set up Church of England.

Steve also highlights Defenders of the Faith: Juan Diego, whose Marian apparitions and miraculous tilma led to the conversion of millions in the New World; and John Fisher and Thomas More, who refused to take Henry VIII's Oaths of Secession and Supremacy and prayed for Henry to the moment of their martyrdoms.



Catholic FYI

According to the Merriam-Webster dictionary, the word holiday is derived from the "Old English hāligdæg, from hālig holy + dæg day." Literally speaking a "holiday" is a "holy day."

Historically this always referred to specific holy days in the Christian liturgical calendar, Christmas being one of the highest holy days of the year.

Over time the original meaning was lessened as holy days became associated with vacations and time off of work. Typically Christians would not work on these days, so rest and relaxation were a natural part of every holy day.

This is one of the reasons why "going on a holiday" in Britain is the same phrase as "going on a vacation." At one point in time this was always associated with a specific Christian feast day, celebrating the life of a saint or even in the life of Christ.
