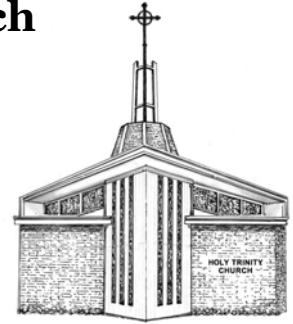

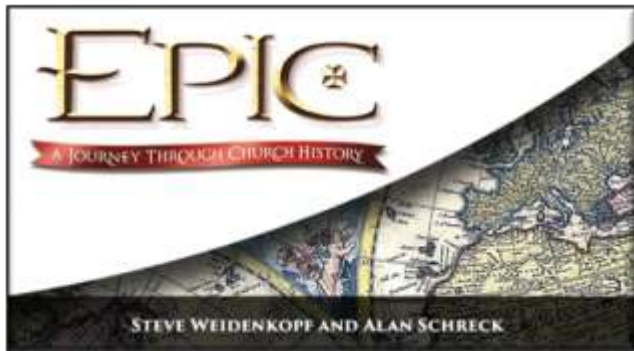

Adult Catholic Studies



On **November 24th**, Steve ends his review of the era with a more detailed summary of the key protestors. He focuses on Luther, who opposed the Church and the papacy and attacked the Jews; Calvin, who systemized Protestant theology and spread it throughout Europe; Zwingli and the Anabaptists, who broke from Luther and Calvin; and Henry VIII, who left the Catholic Church to set up Church of England.

Steve also highlights Defenders of the Faith: Juan Diego, whose Marian apparitions and miraculous tilma led to the conversion of millions in the New World; and John Fisher and Thomas More, who refused to take Henry VIII's Oaths of Secession and Supremacy and prayed for Henry to the moment of their martyrdoms.

On **December 8th**, we will start our two-part video series on the Jewish Roots of Christmas presented by Dr. Brant Pitre. While Easter is the most important Feast in the Church, Christmas is significant, since it truly marks the center of history.

But the more popularized, sentimentalized, and secularized Christmas becomes, the harder it is to remember 'the reason for the season.' To keep Christ and the Mass in Christmas, Dr. Pitre shows us how Jesus and His Nativity fulfilled OT prophecies.

To guide us, Dr. Pitre will discuss the new Christ, the new star, and the new Hannukah. This first class focuses on the new Christ and introduces the new star.

The St. Andrew to Christmas Day Novena

Why 15 times a day? No one really knows, but I'll take a pious stab at some possibilities. The prayer is believed to be over 100 years old, and is traditionally prayed 15 times every day, though not necessarily all at once. (It may be broken up to be prayed throughout the day, such as five prayers in the morning, afternoon, and evening, the way the Angelus is repeated, or the Divine Office is spread out throughout the day.) The number 15 reminds me of the original 15 decades of the rosary, which was itself seen as a potentially simplified version of praying the 150 psalms that are still sung today by religious in monasteries and convents praying the Divine Office all over the world. There you go, not official, but it could explain why 15 times.

Not to mention that the 15 repetitions a day definitely drives home the visual of how blessed that *hour and moment was at midnight, in Bethlehem, in piercing cold*, so much so, that those words just seem to waft in the subconscious all day long. Which is why it's such a perfect Advent prayer of preparation and petition. It helps to keep the scattered mind focused on spiritually preparing for Christmas during the busy and noisy modern holiday season.
