





St. Teresa of Avila



Teresa of Ávila (1515–1582) was a Spanish Carmelite nun, mystic, and writer who founded the Discalced Carmelite order. She is renowned for her spiritual writings on contemplative prayer and her determination in reforming the Carmelite order. In 1970, she and Catherine of Siena were the first women to be named Doctors of the Church. Canonized a saint in 1622 and her feast day is **October 15th.** One of her most famous passages, found on a bookmark after her death, reads: "Let nothing disturb you. Let nothing frighten you. All things are passing. God alone never changes".
