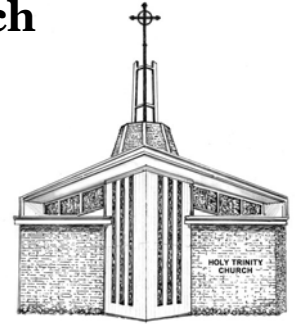

Holy Rosary Feast Day

On October 7th, 1571 a fleet of ships assembled by the combined forces of Naples, Sardinia, Venice, the Papacy, Genoa, Savoy and the Knights Hospitallers fought an intense battle with the fleet of the Ottoman Empire.

The battle took place in the Gulf of Patras located in western Greece. Though outnumbered by the Ottoman forces, the so-called "Holy League" possessed of superior firepower would win the day.

This victory would severely curtail attempts by the Ottoman Empire to control the Mediterranean, causing a seismic shift in international relations from East to West. In some respects, the world that we know came into being with this victory. This event is known to history as the "Battle of Lepanto."

Pope Pius V ordered the churches of Rome opened for prayer day and night, encouraging the faithful to petition the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary through the recitation of the Rosary.

When word reached the Pope Pius of the victory of the Holy League, he added a new feast day to the Roman Liturgical Calendar- October 7th would henceforth be the feast of Our Lady of Victory. Pope Pius' successor, Gregory XIII would change the name of this day to the feast of the Holy Rosary.



Praying the Rosary

Holding the crucifix of the Rosary, make the Sign of the Cross .

It is good to begin your Rosary by offering it for some intention. Example: "I offer this Rosary for all my spiritual needs and those of my family, for the conversion of sinners, in reparation for my sins and those of all sinners, for world peace and the triumph of Mary's Immaculate Heart."

On the crucifix, pray the Apostles' Creed.

On the first single bead after the crucifix, pray an Our Father.

On each of the next three beads, which are grouped together, pray a Hail Mary.

After the three Hail Marys, pray the Glory be. This is where the "decades" begin.

On the next single bead, announce the decade and then pray an Our Father. (Example: "The First Joyful Mystery, the Annunciation. Our Father, Who art...")

On each of the ten beads that follow, pray a Hail Mary while meditating upon the mystery assigned

Looking at a picture depicting the mystery may make it easier to meditate.

After the ten Hail Marys, pray the "Glory be" and "O my Jesus..."

Repeat steps 6 and 7 until you have prayed all 5 decades.

Many Catholics also pray the "Hail Holy Queen," the Prayer to St. Michael, and the Litany of the Blessed Virgin at the end of the Rosary.

the Devil.

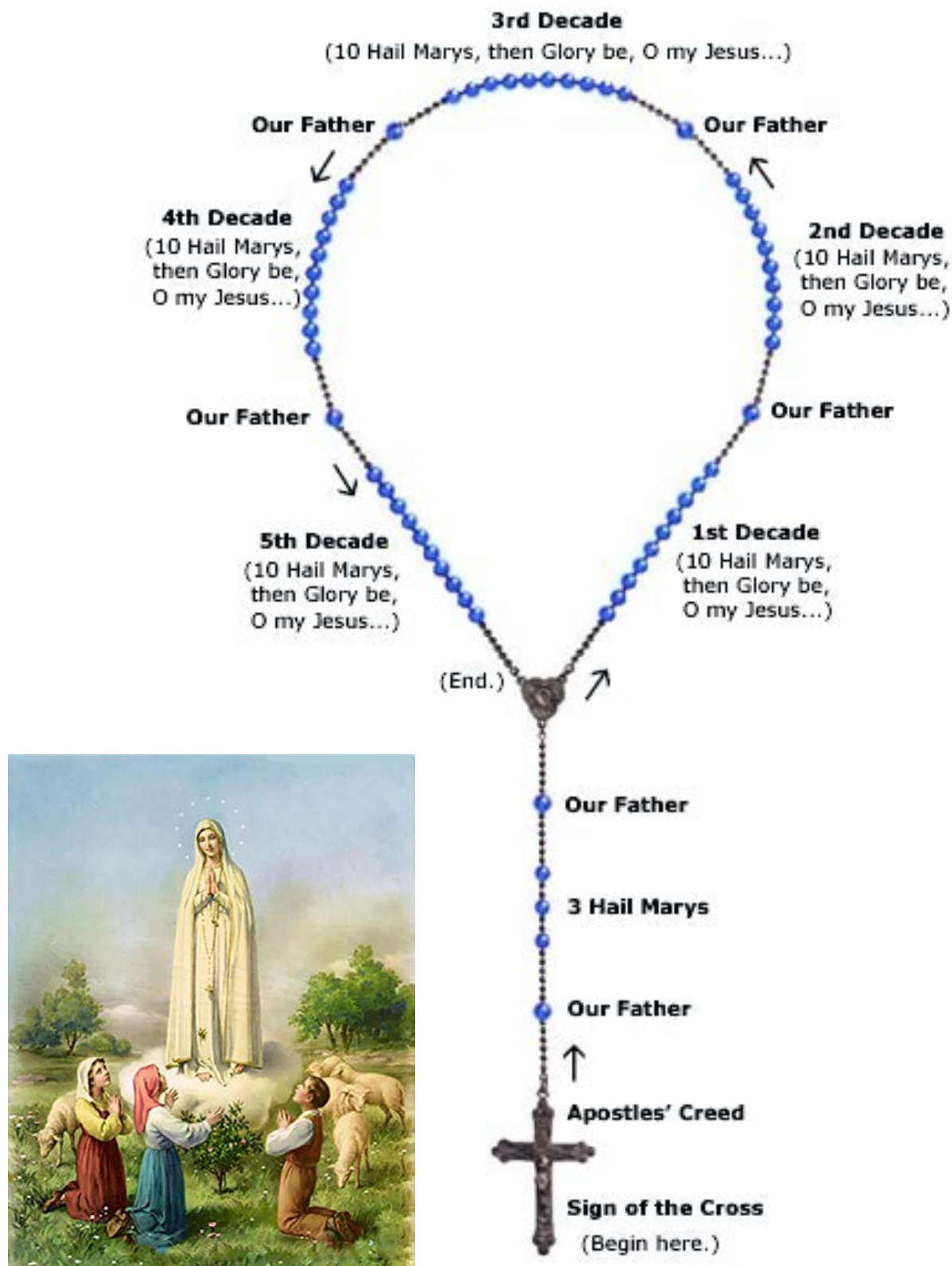
