



Adult Catholic Studies

Prayer: Into the Deep



In this series, prolific author and speaker Dan Burke explains the foundations of prayer which he's taught to countless seminarians, priests, and religious.

Having already discussed the crucial differences between the pantheism (also called monism) of extremely popular Eastern meditation and the true theism of Christian prayer in previous classes, Dan now focuses on the nature and incredible benefits of mental prayer.


