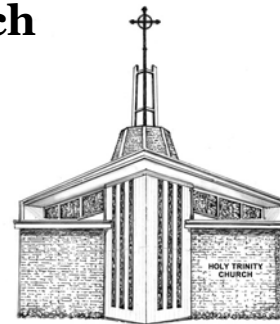

On **October 13th**, we begin Loving in Truth, a two-part follow-up to our Fearless in Faith series. Learning from Rod Dreher's Live Not by Lies, we want to help you better understand and explain the Church's wise teaching on tough in-the-news topics.

In The Enduring Dignity of Human Life, we discuss the Sanctity-of-Life ethic; the reversal of Roe v. Wade and its repercussions; and the crucial facts few know concerning the harms inherent in abortion, chemical abortion, and In-Vitro Fertilization (IVF).

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

As Catholics we are morally obliged to exercise our right to vote. (CCC 2240) We are all called to faithful citizenship (see *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship: A Call to Political Responsibility from the Catholic Bishops of the United States* at the USCCB website), so I encourage you to register to vote and inform yourselves regarding the issues and candidates keeping in mind Catholic teaching and using prudential judgment when you cast your vote. A candidate's record and past actions are more telling than what their campaign ads say, or what others say about them.

Colorado residents will face many important issues on the 2024 ballot. One of great concern to me is Amendment 79. Also known as the "Right to Abortion" amendment, this measure is extreme and unnecessary.

We know that Catholic teaching has always affirmed the right to life for every child from the moment of conception. Therefore, there can never be a "right" to abortion which takes the life of an unborn child.

Tragically, Colorado law already allows abortion for any reason up to birth. Our state has no age limits on those seeking abortion. Should this amendment pass, our state legislature would be prevented from advancing any common-sense limitations on abortion. Current requirements for parental notification would be invalidated and impossible to reestablish. This could mean, for example, parents would not be made aware if their 15-year-old daughter was being pressured to abort by a boyfriend or school counselor.

Amendment 79 would also remove the current prohibition on public funding for abortion. It would not only allow Medicaid and government insurance to pay for abortions using taxpayer dollars, but it would also pave the way for the Colorado Legislature to broaden taxpayer funded abortions for in-state and out-of-state women including barbaric late-term abortions on babies who feel pain and are able to survive outside the womb.

As a community, we must stand together to protect the most vulnerable among us and ensure that our constitution reflects respect for life and parental rights. As faithful Catholics, I urge all of us to consider this amendments grave implications, we must vote "no" on Amendment 79.

Catholic FYI

Funeral Mass

You **can** have a Catholic funeral if you're cremated. The Catholic Church lifted its ban on cremation in 1963, and as long as the cremation takes place within the rules set aside by the Vatican for the proper disposition of remains, Catholics can be cremated before the funeral Mass. The Catholic Church teaches that the human body is a temple of the Holy Spirit, and that it should be treated with respect. However, the Church also teaches that death is not the end, but rather a transition to eternal life. As such, the Church does not believe that cremation prevents a person from being saved.

If you are a Catholic who wants to be cremated, there are a few things you should keep in mind. First, you should make sure that your wishes are known to your family and friends. Next, you should choose a funeral home that is familiar with Catholic funeral rites. Finally, faithful members should be prepared to comply with the rules that the Catholic Church has set in place so that Catholics can respectfully be cremated before the funeral Mass.

Hierarchy of Values to Guide Voting as a Catholic

1

SANCTITY OF LIFE

Human life must be protected at all stages from conception until natural death.

2

MARRIAGE AND FAMILY

Marriage is the union of a man and a woman who together as husband and wife may become father and mother to any children they produce.

3

RELIGIOUS LIBERTY

Religious liberty is rooted in the dignity of the human person, including freedom of conscience and expression, and is central to the U.S. Constitution.

4

ECONOMIC JUSTICE, POVERTY, & WELFARE

Economic decisions should respect human dignity and express a preferential option for helping the poor and vulnerable through safety nets and opportunities for upward mobility.

5

HEALTHCARE

Healthcare should be patient-centered, respect human dignity, protect life, promote the principle of subsidiarity, be affordable and assure conscience rights.

6

IMMIGRATION & PROMOTING FOREIGN PEACE

Immigration policy should provide immigrants with basic human needs, including the ability to work, and should encourage pathways to citizenship. Promoting peace is essential in international relations.

7

EDUCATION

Parents are the primary educators of their children; therefore, education policy should empower parents with education decision-making authority to choose best learning options for their children.

8

RESTORATIVE JUSTICE

Criminal justice reform should focus on preventing crime and caring for survivors of crime, while also offering those who commit a crime an opportunity to rehabilitate and effectively return to society.

9

ENERGY & ENVIRONMENT

Care for the environment and responsible use of energy resources come from our duty to steward creation and provide for future generations.

10

TECHNOLOGY

Technology must respect human dignity and protect children.

This amendment creates a constitutional “right” to unrestricted, unregulated abortion for all 40 weeks of pregnancy – even on healthy mothers and babies— and allows for taxpayer-funded abortion by repealing the constitutional ban on public funding. This amendment will remove the constitutional definition of marriage as the “union of one man and one woman.” While *Obergefell* made same-sex marriage status quo, there are still important considerations concerning a ballot measure to remove the definition of marriage from the constitution. 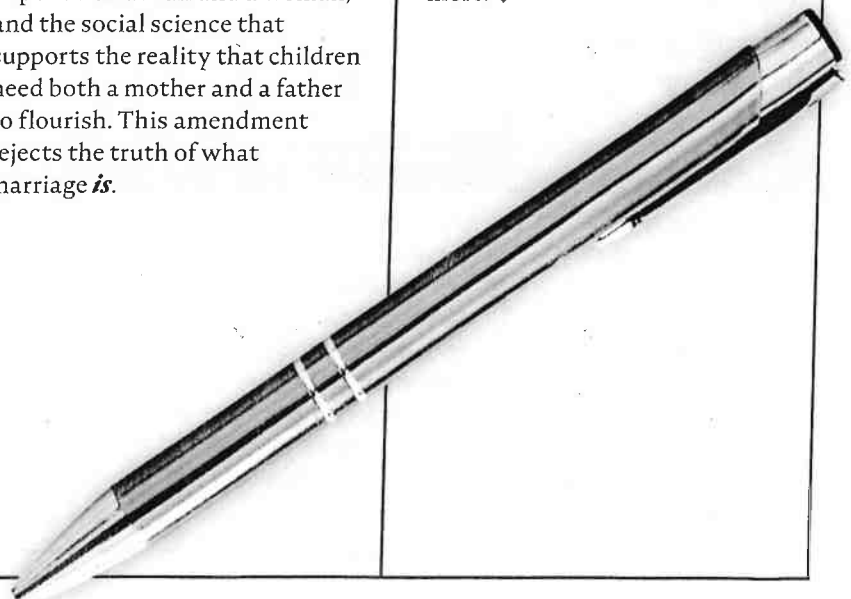
