

Adult Catholic Studies



On **October 27th**, we resume EPIC: A Journey Through Church History. In this episode, Steve Weidenkopf says seeking the world's riches causes men's hearts to grow cold. While European rulers seek to increase their power, so do some popes.

In 1309, Pope Clement moves the papal residence to Avignon, where it remains for 72 years, until Catherine of Siena persuades the pope to return to Rome. During this time, the Black Death kills almost a third of Europe's population, including thousands of priests and religious who stay to tend to the sick. When Martin V is elected in 1417, Christian unity is restored. but papal authority has been weakened, when it is most needed.

On **November 3rd**, Steve tells us about proto-Protestants and their heretical 'new gospel;' the heroism and martyrdom of Joan of Arc; the fall of Constantinople to the Turks, the conversion of Christendom's largest church into a mosque, and the final defeat of Islam in the West.

Steve also focuses on the much-misunderstood period of the Inquisition. Since the procedures were meticulously documented and carefully preserved, we know the accused were given a time of grace, a fair trial, and defense attorneys. We also know that, in the 250 years of the Inquisition, far fewer were executed than is typically portrayed, and that the executions were carried out by the state, not by the Church.

Finally, Steve explains that, in Rome, the long line of Renaissance popes from Nicolas V to Leo X ushered in an age of learning and splendor. They also commissioned works by some of history's greatest artists: Michelangelo, Raphael, DaVinci, and others.

Catholic FYI

...We as people in our modern, Western culture have a sense of duty and justice when it comes to other things in our daily lives. Why is it oftentimes so hard for us to break out of our own bad habits and recognize that we also owe God a great deal?

"Justice is the moral virtue that consists in the constant and firm will to five their due to God and neighbor. Justice toward God is called the 'virtue of religion'." (CCC1807)

To give someone "their due", means that we owe something to someone. We are obliged to render what is due to that someone. And in the case of Holy Days of Obligation, that "Someone" is God himself.

...if we love him, if we truly love him with our whole hearts and minds, then we will obey him and do that which we are obliged to do as his disciples.

"The precepts of the Church are set in the context of a moral life bound to and nourished by liturgical life. The obligatory character of these positive laws decreed by the pastoral authorities is meant to guarantee to the faithful the indispensable minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor" (CCC 2041).

...if someone asks why they are obligated to go to Mass on All Saints Day, before giving them the Scriptural and traditional reasons why, we should first ask, "Why would you want to pass up Mass in the first place?" As I mentioned, love comes first, and then obedience. We do what is asked of us **because** we love.
