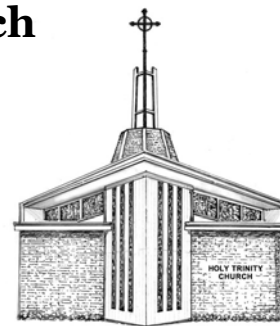

Adult Catholic Studies



With many frightening things facing us today, including attacks on churches and people of faith, we need help overcoming our fear. Popular Catholic speaker Chris Stefanick says that if we build up and practice the gift of fortitude the way we build up and use muscle, it will help us become fearless.

On **September 15th**, Chris' daughter Rosemary tells how she overcame fear when she realized MS was the cross God was giving to get her to Heaven. Chris then talks with Franciscan University's Fr. Dave Pivonka who says Satan and the powers-that-be want us to fear. As Father points out, Adam's first words after the fall were "I was afraid."

On **September 22nd**, Chris interviews exorcist Father Chad Ripperger, "a real-life ghostbuster." Fr. Chad says fear is the sorrow and pain we feel when we perceive a future evil which cannot be overcome. He reminds us that demons "are on a short leash." They admit, in exorcisms, that they're slaves to Christ. This means God can bring good out of fear!

Chad Ripperger, one of the Catholic Church's pre-eminent exorcists, has written a special prayer consecrating the 2024 general election to the Virgin Mary in her role as patroness of America, asking that voters receive the grace to elect the right leaders and halt what he said has been a "slouching towards communism."

Father announced the consecration prayer Sept. 3 on the "U.S. Grace Force" podcast and urged everyone to recite the prayer daily through the Nov. 5 election.

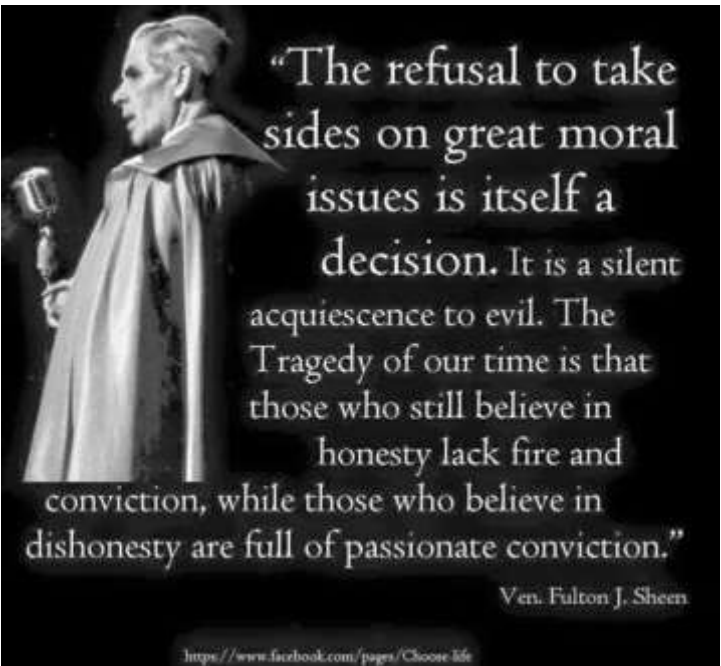

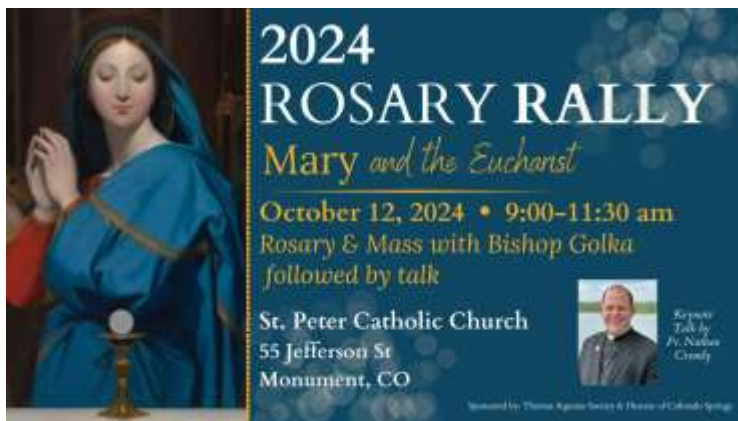

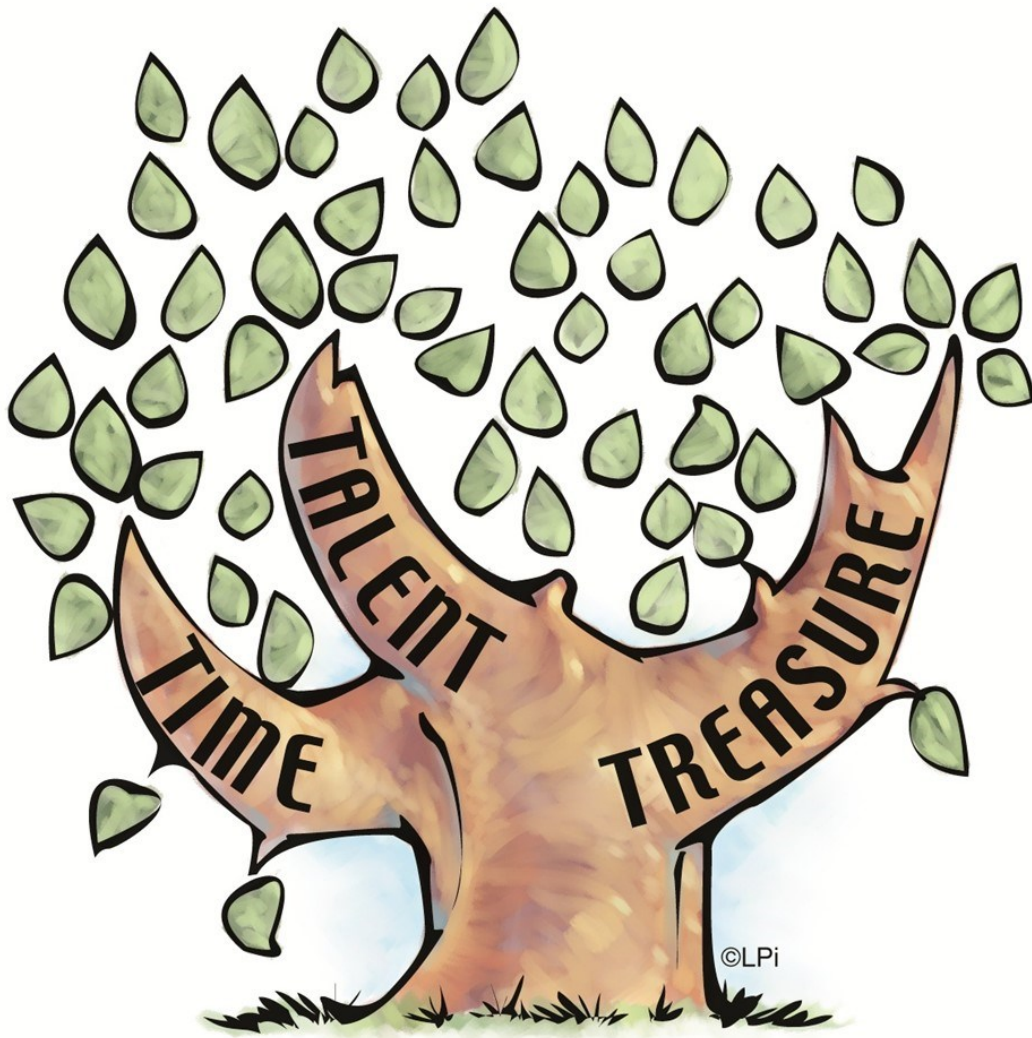
