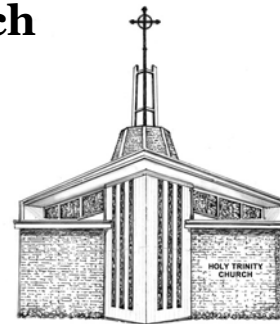

Sacraments

Marriage: All engaged couples participate in a Marriage Preparation Program (a policy of the Diocese of Colorado Springs), Contact the parish office AT LEAST ONE YEAR IN ADVANCE of your planned marriage to begin preparation.

Funerals: Please call the parish office **before** scheduling date and time with a funeral home. The parish office schedules presiders, musicians, and servers in consultation with family members.

Prayer: Into the Deep



While vocal prayer like the Rosary is good, the Doctors of the Church think it's not enough. For example, St. Teresa of Avila says, "If you do not practice mental

prayer, you don't need any devil to throw you into hell; you throw yourself there of your own accord."

In this series, Avila Institute founder Dan Burke explains the foundations of prayer which he has taught to hundreds of seminarians and priests.

Required State: All Catholics are encouraged to participate (CCC 1417); Baptized believers in communion with the Catholic Church (CCC 1396-1401) and devoid of Mortal Sin (CCC 1415)

Frequency: Minimum of once a year, as frequently as daily (CCC 1389; 1417)

Scripture: John 6:1-71; Matt 26:26-28; Mark 14:22-25; Luke 22:7-20; 24:13-53; Acts 2:42-47; 20:7; 1Cor 10:16-21

Effect: Intimate Union with Christ (CCC 1391); receiving Christ nourish spiritual life; medicine of immortality, separating us from sin, removal of venial sin, spiritual strength, unites the Body into One (CCC 1391-1401)

Minister: the Priest (CCC 1411)

Form: “This is My Body which will be given up for you. Do this in memory of Me... Take this, all of you, and drink from it: this is the cup of My Blood, the Blood of the new and Everlasting Covenant. Life Chain / Respect Life

October is Respect Life Month, and there are various ways for you to participate:

The **Red Rose** is the symbol for Respect Life and reminds us to pray for life. Pike Peaks Citizens for Life promotes reverence and respect for human life without regard to condition, age, race, religion, or color, whether born or unborn. This is the main fundraiser which allows PPCFL to keep the pro-life message alive in our city through education and the media. Roses will be handed out next weekend after each Mass. Donations will be gratefully accepted.

Life Chain is Sunday, October 1, from 1:30-3:00 at Austin Bluffs & Academy. Please join us for a peaceful public witness of pro-life individuals standing for ninety minutes praying for our nation and for an end to abortion. A visual statement of solidarity by the Christian community that abortion kills children and that the Church supports the sanctity of human life from conception to natural death. Whether we are cradle Catholics or new to the Faith,
St. Peter tells us to:
