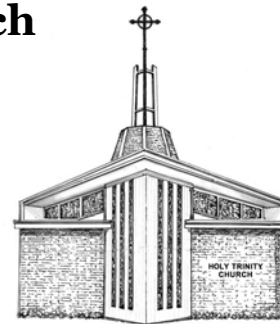

Adult Catholic Studies



With many frightening things facing us today, including attacks on churches and people of faith, we need help overcoming our fear. Popular Catholic speaker Chris Stefanick says that if we build up and practice the gift of fortitude the way we build up and use muscle, it will help us become fearless.

On **September 29th**, Chris talks about a priest in Slovakia who refused to preach Communism and was imprisoned and tortured. Chris says he is, in contrast, a “sissy” who fears being cancelled.

Guest Paul Kim says that, thanks to social media, we’re all being programmed to respond to feedback we immediately get, even from strangers or robots.

Paul observes that “the fear of being cancelled is less than the fear Satan has of faithful Christians who know who they are, know Whose they are, and are firmly grounded in the truth.” In short, Satan fears bold people who dare to speak up and speak out.

On **October 13th**, we begin Loving in Truth, a two-part follow-up to our Fearless in Faith series. Learning from Rod Dreher’s Live Not by Lies, we want to help you better understand and explain the Church’s wise teaching on tough in-the-news topics.

In The Enduring Dignity of Human Life, we discuss the Sanctity-of-Life ethic; the reversal of Roe v. Wade and its repercussions; and the crucial facts few know concerning the harms inherent in abortion, chemical abortion, and In-Vitro Fertilization (IVF).

The word “novena” comes from the Latin word novem which means “nine” as they involve nine days of prayer for a specific petition or grace.

We actually hear about the first “novena” in Sacred Scripture in Acts of the Apostles.

After the Ascension, Christ’s apostles alongside the Blessed Mother gathered together in the Upper Room and devoted themselves to constant prayer. Nine days later, the Holy Spirit descended upon them at Pentecost, pouring out grace and spiritual gifts.

These nine days became a model of prayer for many Christians, and have been used to develop several devotions that involve nine days or nine months of prayer for a specific intention.

Respect Life Month

Life Chain is Sunday, October 6, from 1:30-3:00 at Austin Bluffs & Academy.
